2021 Summer School Program - Session 1

Welcome to the 2021 Summer School Program at Coolidge Elementary School! We are excited to begin this year's program and look forward to the engaging learning activities for all students. All summer school classes are free of charge this year. Students who attend Summer School will participate in various Reading and Math activities as well as STEM, Music, PE, and Social Emotional Learning. In order to ensure students are successful, we ask that students are dropped off and picked up in a prompt manner. Students that are not picked up within fifteen minutes of Summer School ending will be disenrolled from the program after the second time. A few expectations of attending Summer School are:

- 1. Be Prompt and prepared to work
- 2. Be Respectful of the teacher and other students
- 3. Work hard and give your best effort

Please review the information below regarding arrival and dismissal as well as some general information about summer school.

General Information

- Summer School classes are held at Coolidge Elementary School (17845 Henry Street) from 8:15 a.m. –
 12:45 p.m. on the following dates: June 7th July 2nd (Monday Friday)
- Being respectful, responsible and safe is expected of all students. Parents/guardians will be notified if there are any disciplinary issues and may be required to pick up their child. Depending on the severity of the disciplinary issue, your child may be disenrolled from their program.
- Bus transportation is not available for summer school students.
- Fifth grade students will attend summer school at Memorial Junior High School.

Breakfast/Snacks

- Breakfast will be offered to the students attending summer school at no cost. Breakfast will be
 available from 8:00 a.m. 8:15 a.m. The students will eat in the Multipurpose Room, Art Room or
 Band/Flex Room. Students who eat breakfast will have assigned seats, will have dividers and will be
 socially distanced.
- Students can bring a healthy snack (fruit, carrots, pretzels, crackers, etc.) and a water bottle to summer school. **Students will not be permitted to use water fountains.**

Dress Code

- Students should wear appropriate shoes/clothing for recess activities. Flip-flops will not be permitted. The regular school year dress code applies to summer school as well.
- To ensure an effective learning environment is maintained, students are not permitted to bring toys, cards, hand-held video games/electronics or other non-instructional items to summer school.
- Students will participate in motor breaks outside, weather permitting.

Covid/Health Protocols

Summer school staff and students will follow the same Health Protocols and Preventative Measures as described in the Lansing School District 158 E-Learning & Reopening Transition Plan.

- Each student will be provided with a tri-fold clear divider to use on their desks throughout summer school. The barriers will be sanitized daily. If a student damages or destroys a desktop barrier, they may be required to purchase a new divider for \$28.00.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in each classroom.

- Temperature checks will be taken daily before class begins.
- The summer school staff will make every attempt to keep students socially distanced.
- Students will be required to wear a mask during summer school. Students who refuse to wear a mask will be removed from class and will not be allowed to participate in summer school.
- Please review good hygiene habits and other preventative measures with your child prior to the start of summer school to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Prior to coming to school each day, students and staff should assess themselves for any COVID-like symptoms (listed below). If a student exhibits any COVID-like symptoms, they will not be able to attend summer school.

Cough
Runny nose
Chills
Sore throat
Headache
Muscle aches

Muscle aches
Loss of taste or smell
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea

Arrival Information

- Students will enter Coolidge through Door 1 at the main entrance and will either walk to their assigned breakfast location or the classroom. No student should arrive prior to 8:00 a.m.
- Students in the "Get Ready for Kindergarten" and "Summer School Refresher" classes will enter Door 12 at 8:50. Students in these two classes can eat breakfast in the classroom.
- Breakfast will be offered to the students attending summer school at no cost. Breakfast will be served from 8:00 a.m. 8:15 a.m. in the Multipurpose Room, Art Room or Band/Flex Room.
- Henry Street will remain a one-way street heading north towards 178th Street.
- Adams Street will remain a one-way street heading west towards Henry Street.
- William Street will remain a one-way street heading south towards Adams Street.
- The Horseshoe Drive will be open for quick drop-off. Remember to drive carefully and keep the traffic moving. Please be cautious as the students will be exiting the cars.

Dismissal Information

- Summer school dismissal is at 12:45 p.m.
- Students in the "Get Ready for Kindergarten" and the "Summer School Refresher" will be dismissed from Door 12 at 12:30pm.
- Students in First Grade and Second Grade will dismiss out of Door 11 (178th Street).
- Students in Third and Fourth Grade will dismiss out of Door 9 (William Street).
- Henry Street will remain a one-way street heading north towards 178th Street.
- Adams Street will remain a one-way street heading west towards Henry Street.
- William Street will remain a one-way street heading south towards Adams Street.
- Students who have not been picked up will be brought to the main office (Door 1) at 12:55pm.
