All school staff are trained in Child Abuse Reporting Procedures annually, using the <u>online training module</u> provided by the State Department of Social Services. All school staff actively monitor the safety and welfare of all students, and all school and district employees are mandated reporters. Staff members understand their responsibility as childcare custodians and immediately report all cases of known and suspected child abuse to Child Protective Services and the school principal.

## **B - DISASTER RESPONSE PROCEDURES**

The West Sonoma County Union High School District maintains an Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) at each school site. Site specific information is included and updated annually. Students are instructed in their classrooms each year about safety procedures. Student and Staff Drills are conducted as listed below. Maps and procedures and more information are included in our full Emergency Operations Plan (EOP).

Under Government Code 3100, all school personnel are Disaster Services Workers and are required to assist during a disaster until they are released by the Incident Commander/District Superintendent.
