<u>FAQ</u>

Q: What is the main difference between being in the Academy versus simply taking the elective courses on my own?

- There are two main differences. The first is that Academy students are required to take a specific, sequential electives that are unique to each Academy- each building upon skills learned in previous years. Non-Academy students do not have these limitations.
- The second difference is that only Academy students can take Creative Lab. This is a course for students who will 'push the envelope' in terms of creativity and cross-discipline collaboration in ways that have never been done before!
- It's important to remember that the Academy may not be the best option for all students who are passionate about the Performing Arts. Remember, due to the course load requirements and rigor of the Academy, it may not be the best choice for you unless you feel confident in pursuing the arts as a career and/or at the college or university level. Our curricular Performing Arts courses are still available to you whether or not you choose to be in the Academy and, in fact, may be a better option for you if you are unsure about your post-high school pursuits.

Q: Do Theatre Arts Academy Students automatically have a part in the school play/musical?

 No. The Theatre Arts Academy student receives a rich curricular experience through the course work and Creative Lab experience that is not directly connected to participation in extra-curricular school productions. Participation in the play/musical is encouraged and, although Theatre Academy students are expected to audition, there is no guarantee that an Academy student will earn a spot, as she/he will need to audition along with all interested CHS students.

Q: Can a student switch Academies when they want to?

• A student would need to audition into the corresponding Main Elective Course for the upcoming year. (i.e., Band Academy student wants to switch to Dance

Academy for Junior Year would have to successfully audition into Dance 3) and be in good standing in her current Academy track.

Q: Aside from a rich, curricular experience what else does an Academy student earn upon graduation?

- Academy students will be awarded a special certificate at graduation.
- Students will be well-prepared to continue their Performing Arts studies at the collegiate and/or professional level.
