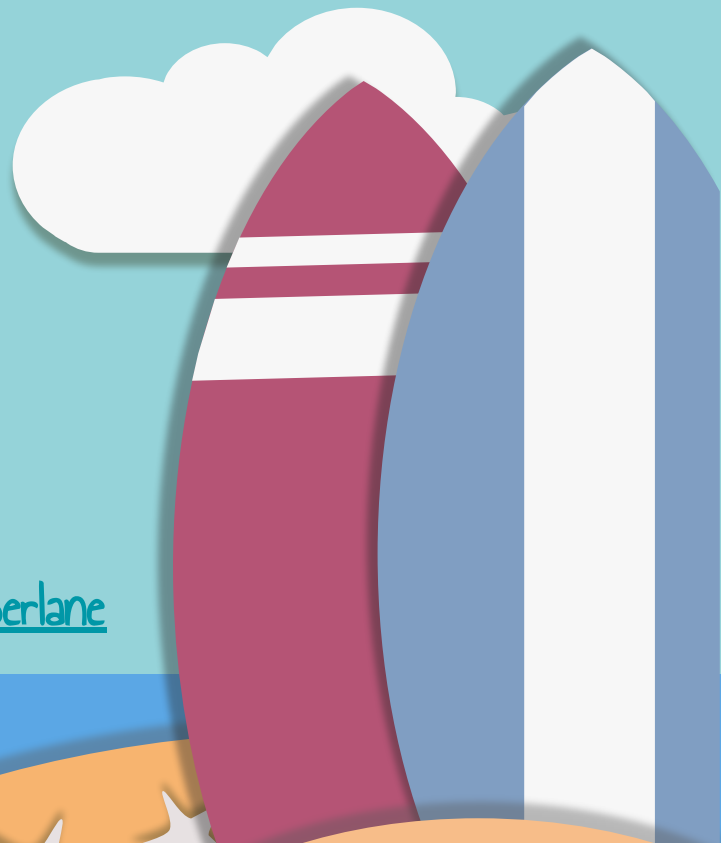

Here's how to participate on paper:

1. Pick up a log at the library.
2. Write down how many minutes you read each day in the appropriate box. (Any reading or listening counts, and it is okay if you don't read every day!)
3. Bring your log into the library each week between Monday, June 26th and Saturday, August 5th to receive a prize.

Here's how to participate online:

1. Visit mcl.org/events/summer-reading-program to sign up.
2. Log in each week to report how many minutes you've read.
3. Stop into the library each week between Monday, June 26th and Saturday, August 5th to receive a prize!

Here are some FAQs:

- You may choose to participate on paper or online, but please stick with your chosen format throughout the summer.
- You may register at any point throughout the Summer Reading Program. If you plan to be away during the Summer Reading Program, you may still participate during the week/s you are here.
- One prize is given per week. No prizes given for missed weeks.
- There is a Teen Summer Reading Program for ages 12-18, as well as an Adult Summer Reading Program - so we encourage you to get the whole family involved.

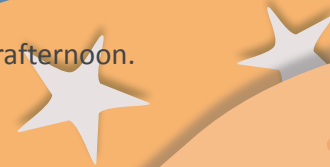
