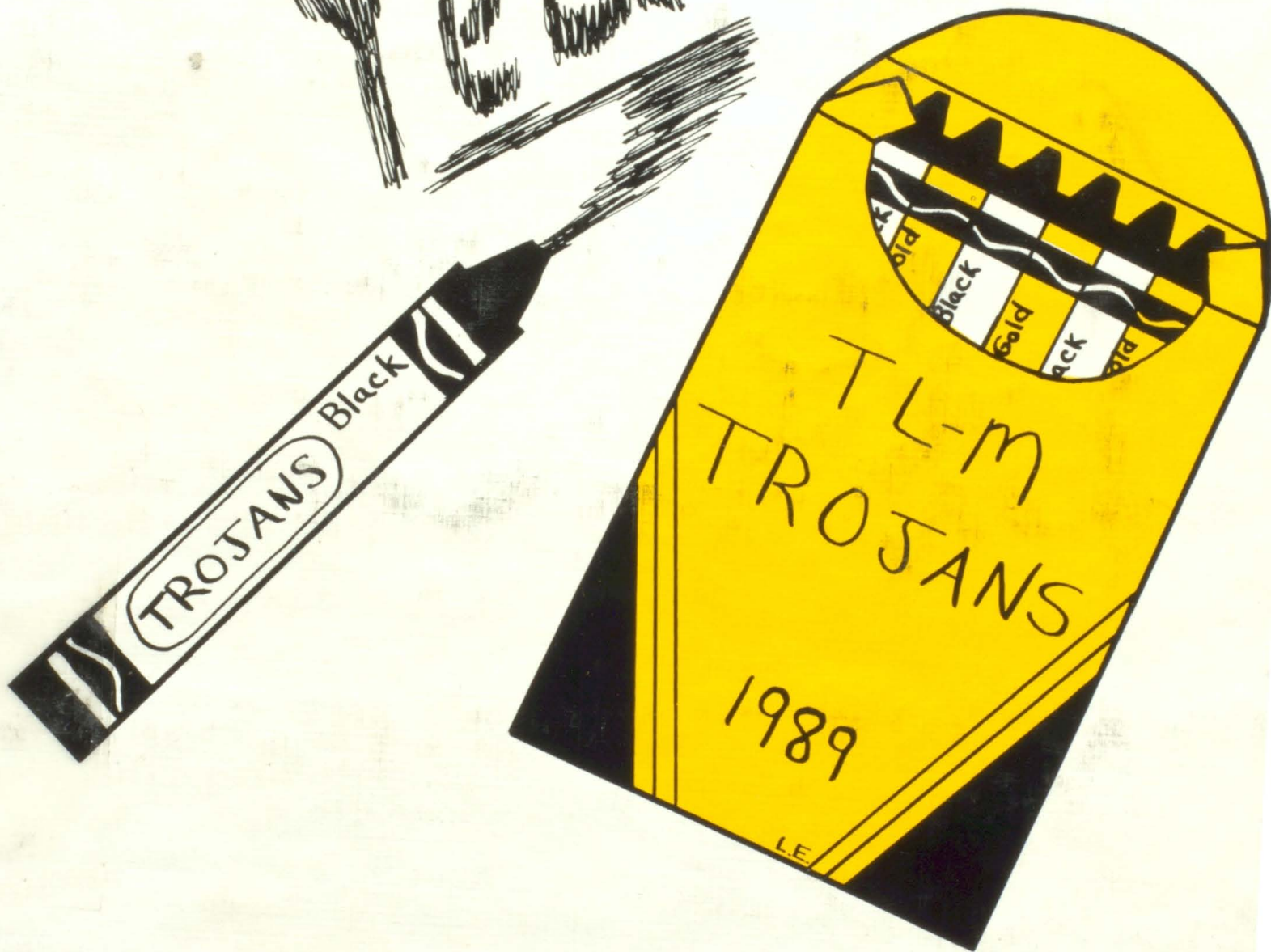


Colorful

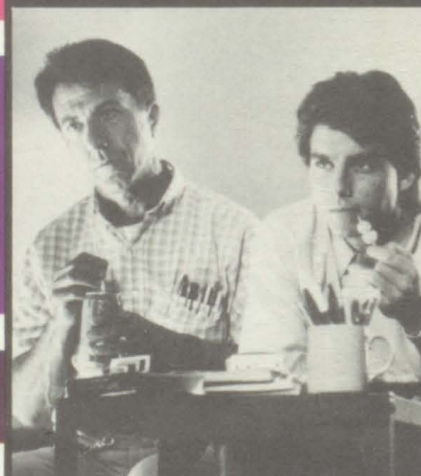


"ALF," the lovable Alien Life Form, starred in his own NBC hit series. America's favorite alien also appeared on various merchandise.

Panama's embattled strongman Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega waved to supporters in the presidential palace in Panama City.

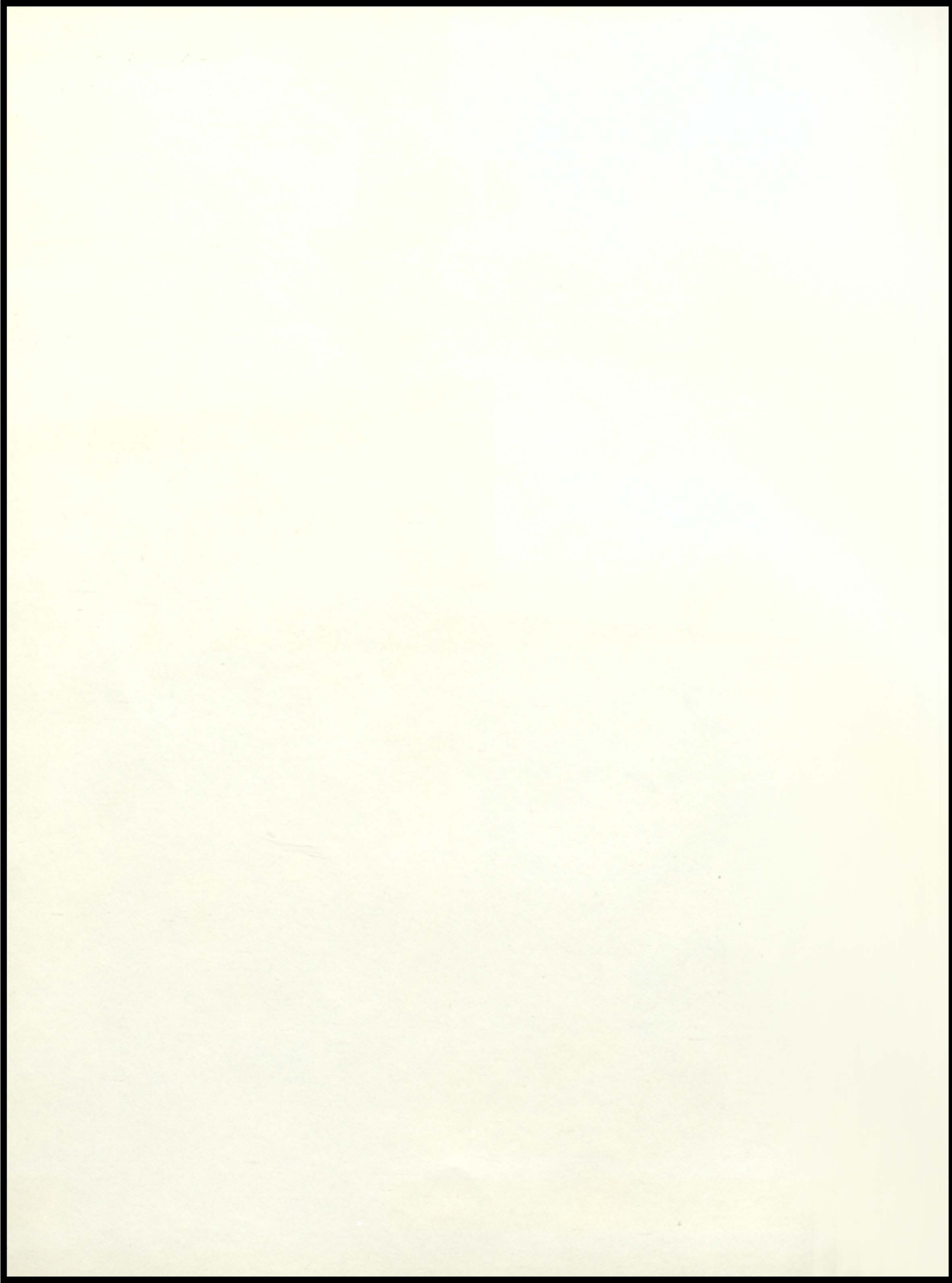


With the launch of the space shuttle Discovery, America re-entered space after the 1986 Challenger disaster. The successful launch took place at Kennedy Space Center in September 1988.

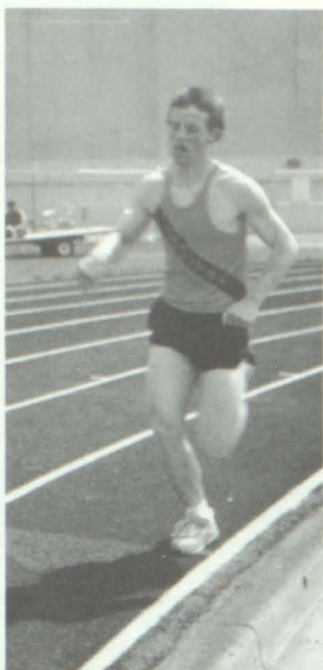

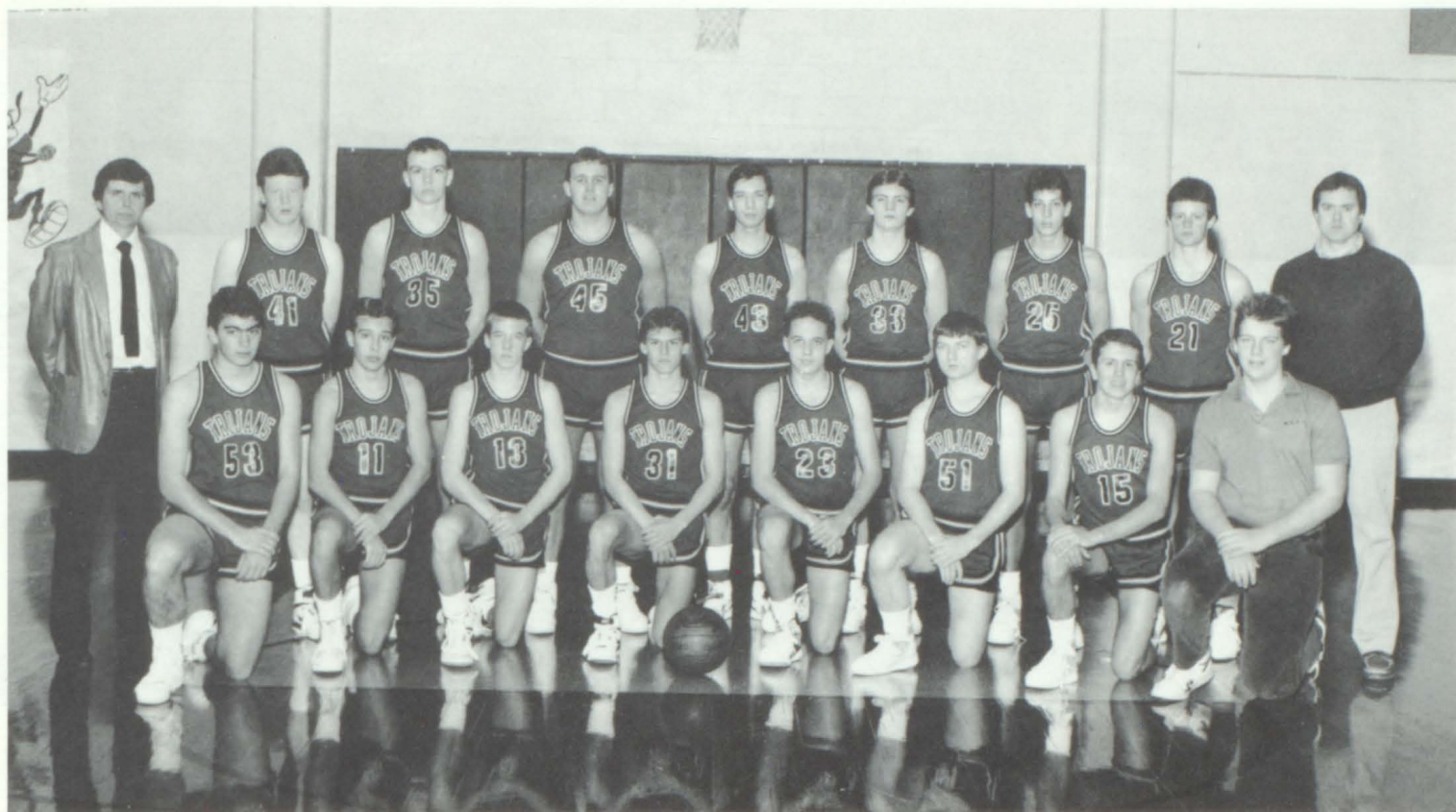
BOYS BASKETBALL

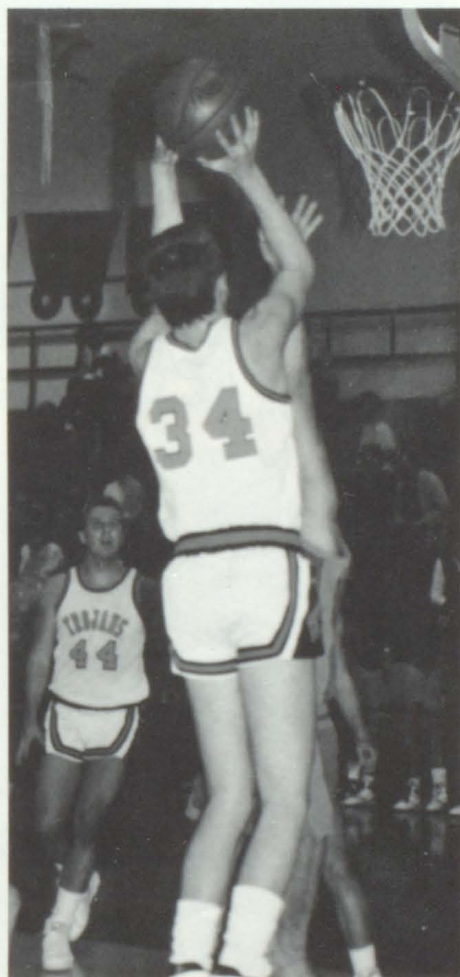

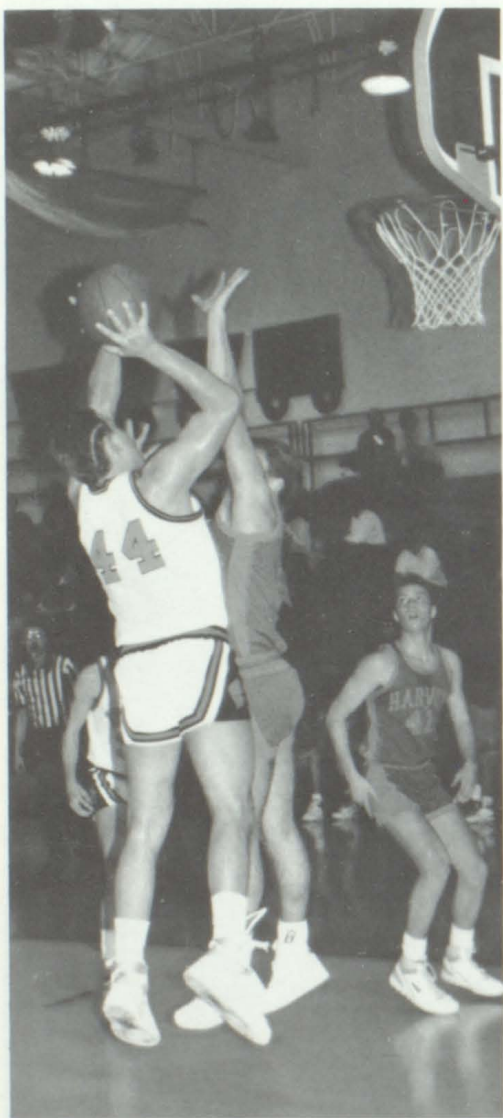

All the students and faculty benefited alot from Madeleine's year with us and we all hope the year was just as rewarding for her. Good luck, we'll miss you, Madeleine!

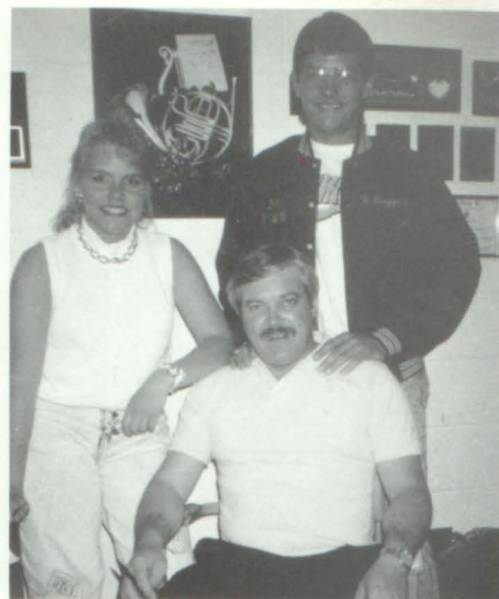

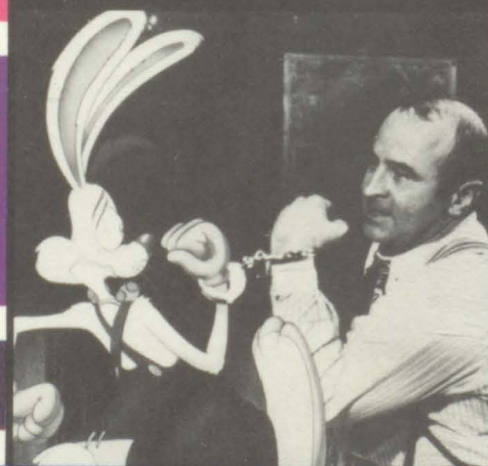


A national smoking ban went into effect on all domestic flights under two hours, raising smokers' ire and non-smokers' satisfaction.

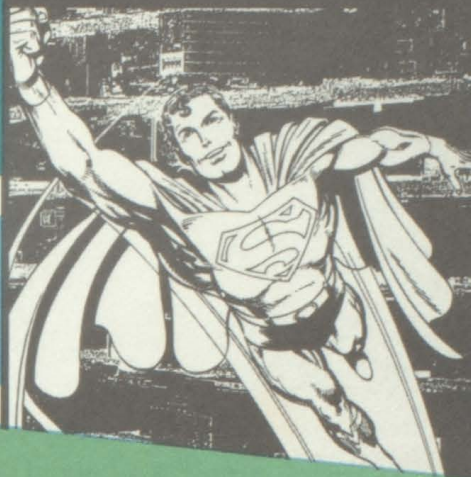

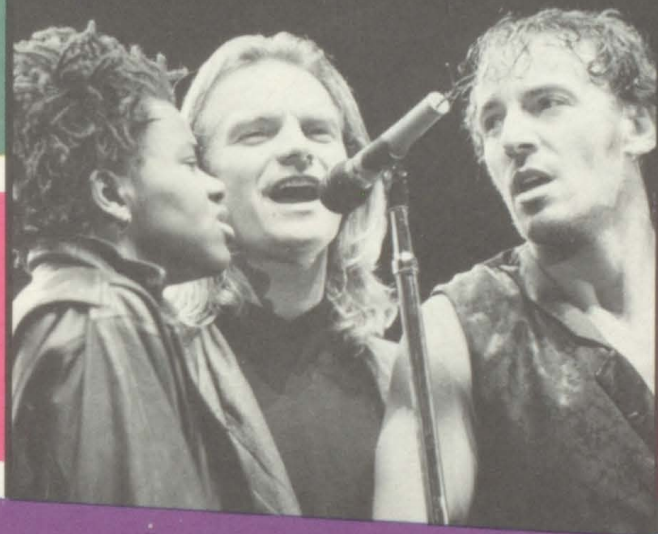
It's a bird! It's a plane! It's Superman's birthday! The granddaddy of comic book heroes celebrated his 50th anniversary in style in 1988.
