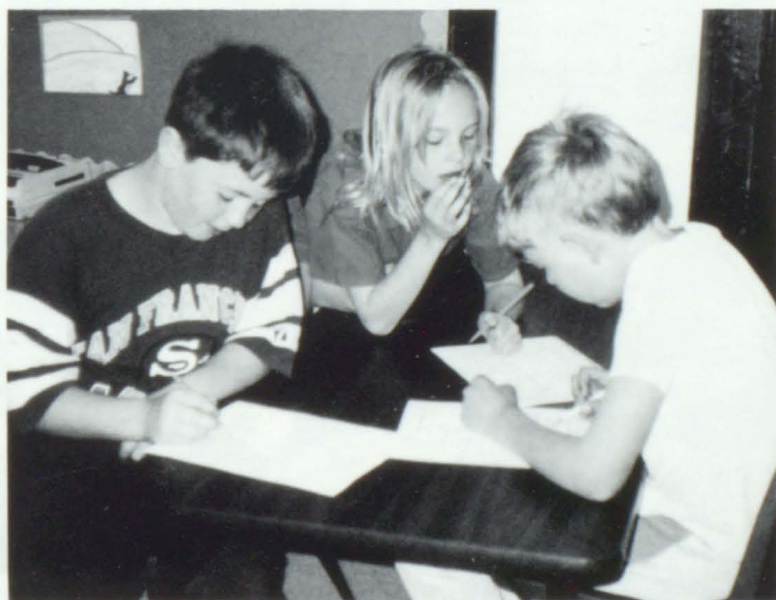

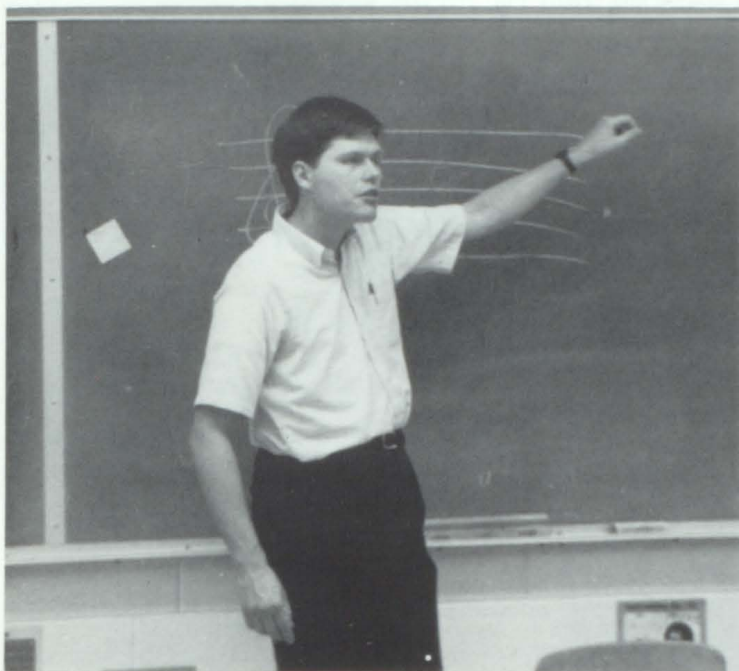

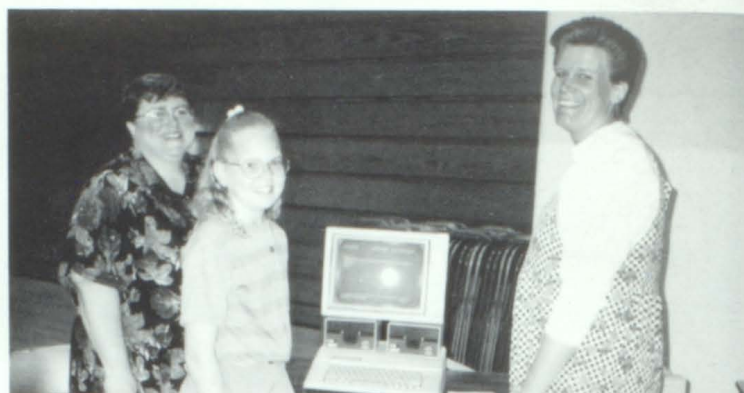

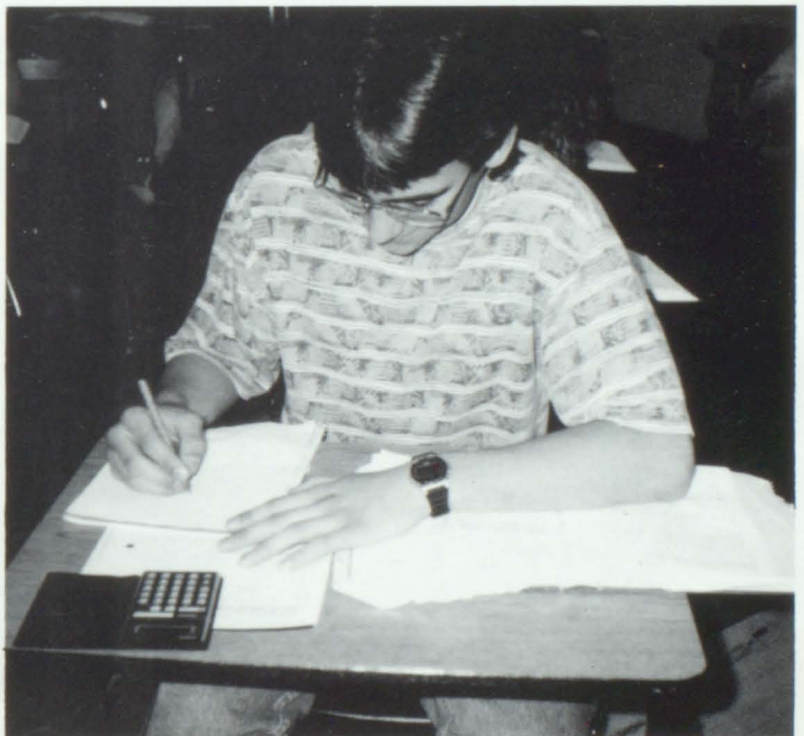

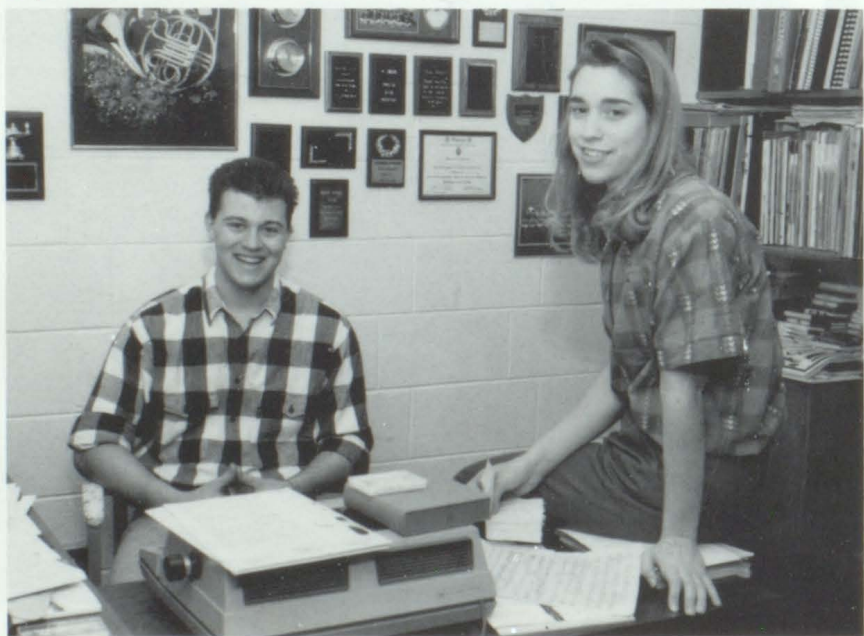

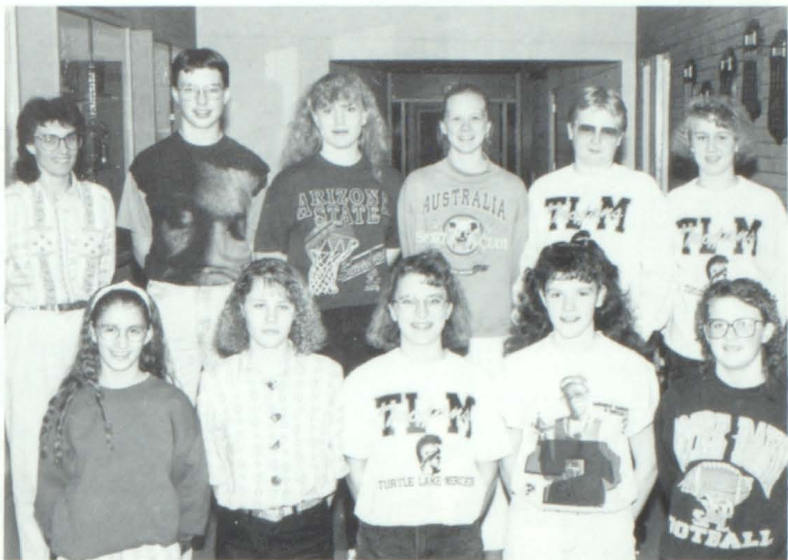

TLM'S INNOVATION IN EDUCATION IATV

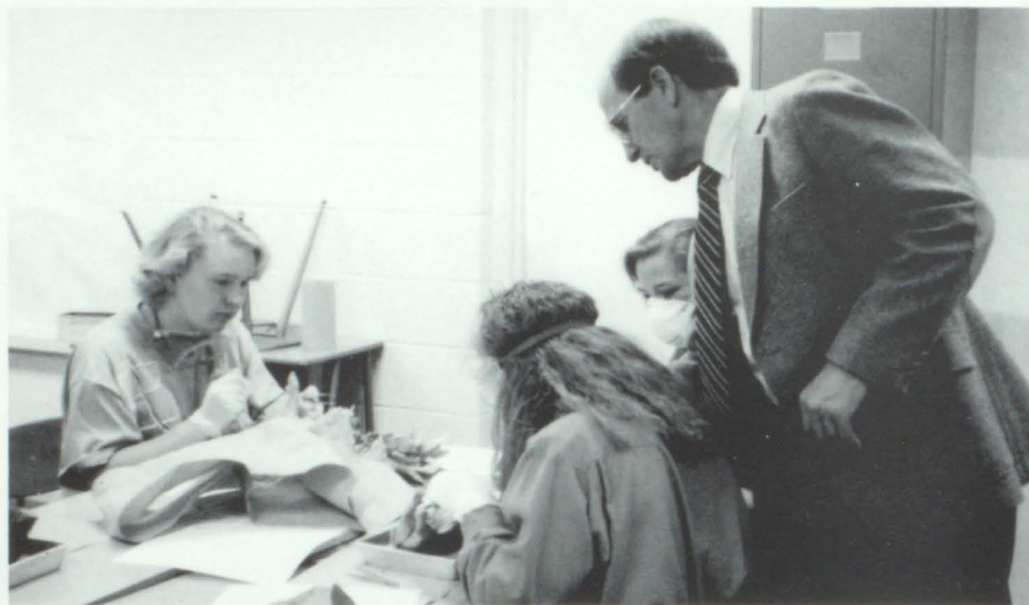

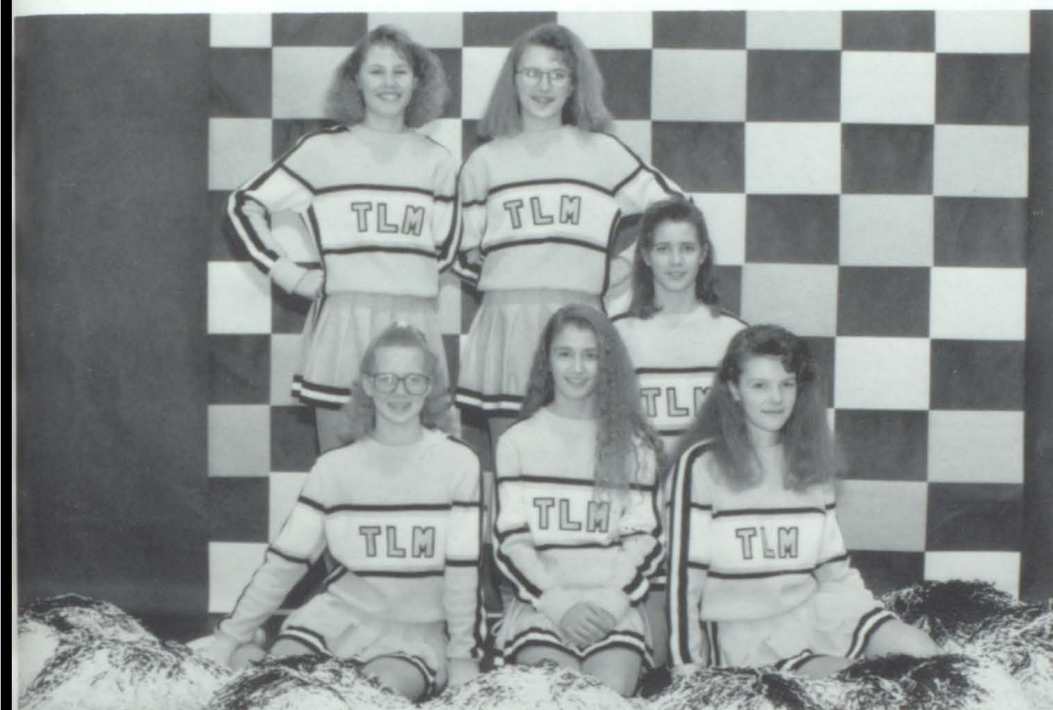

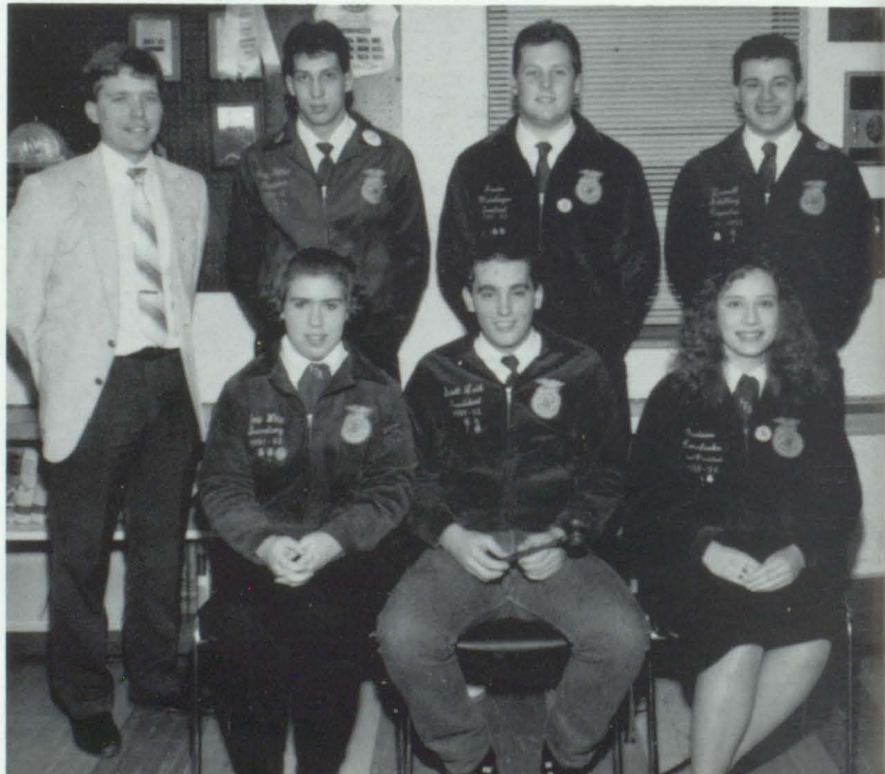

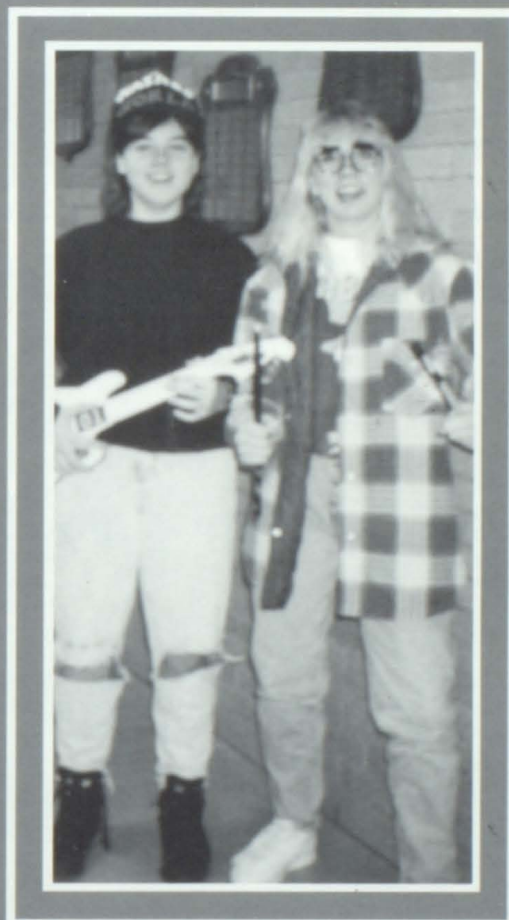

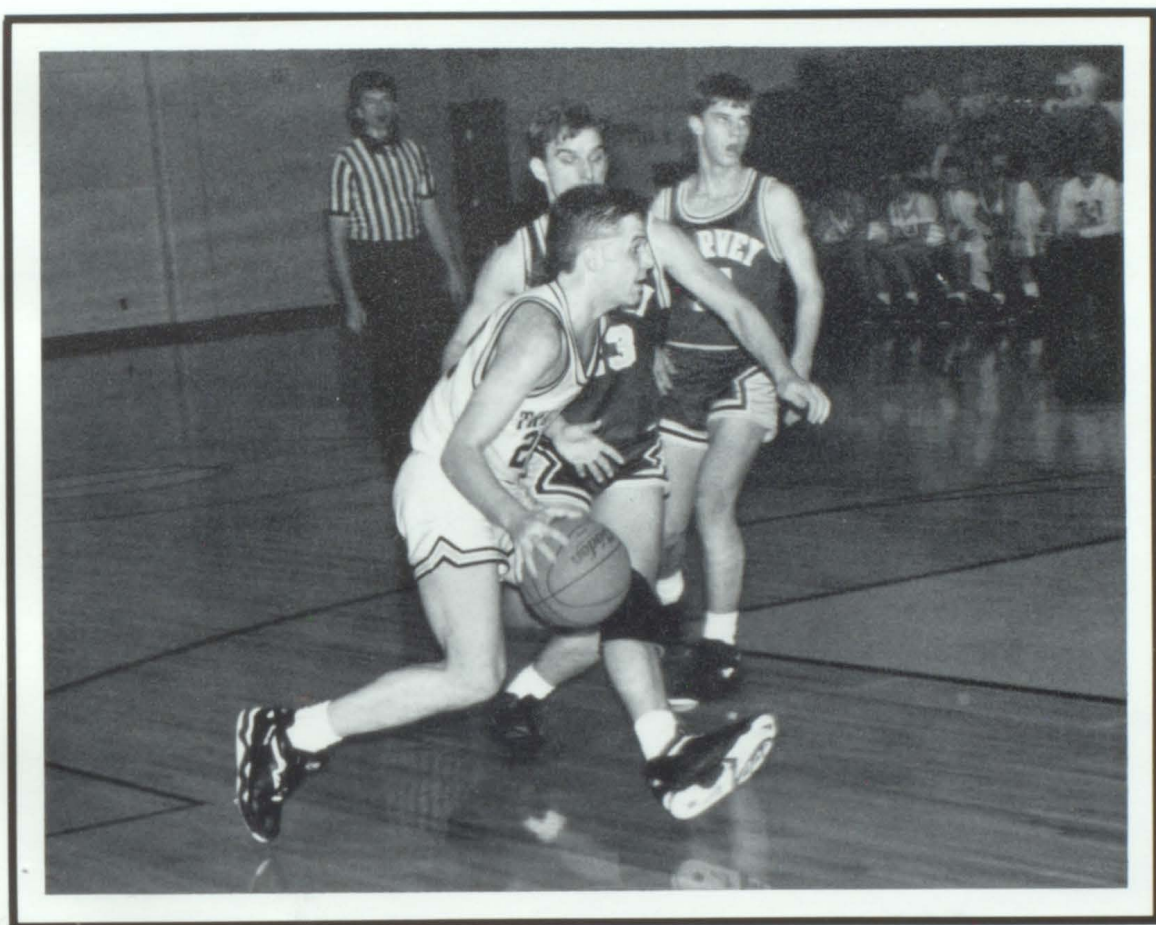

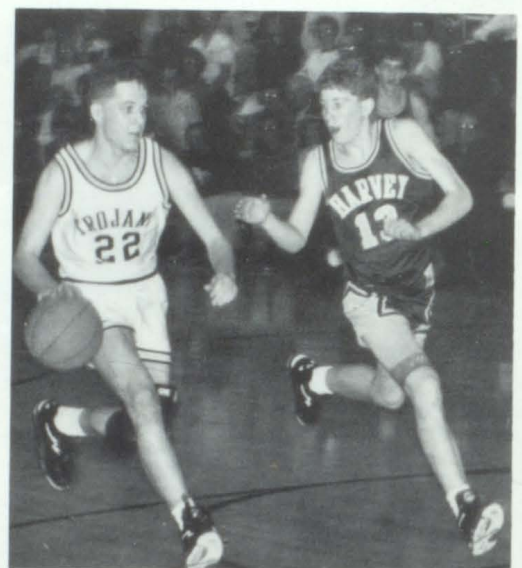
