## Notes from the SCHOOL NURSE Medication in School

### Greetings from the SVSD Nurse!

Oftentimes medication during school hours is necessary to keep our students in the classroom and ready to learn. Please be aware that per Michigan law and Swan Valley Board of Education policy, a written authorization from the parent/guardian AND the health care provider is necessary in order for medication to be given during school hours FOR ANY AGE STUDENT. This includes prescription medication as well as over-the-counter (OTC) medications such as Ibuprofen, Tylenol, Tums, etc. Legally we are unable to provide medication to a student without this written authorization and required signatures.

Please visit your child's school or the SVSD website to obtain the necessary Medication Authorization

Form and ask your physician to complete it before the start of the school year in August. Per state law, a parent/guardian must bring the medication in its original container to school, please DO NOT send medication with your student.

And just a reminder that if your child has prescription or OTC medication in the school at this time, please visit to pick up that medication as soon as possible following the end of the school year. Medications left behind will be properly disposed of per policy.

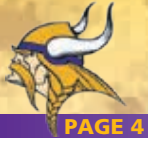

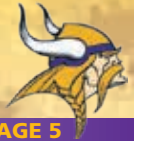

# 20 DISTINGUISHED 23 ALUMNI

## Chris Janczewski

After graduating from Central Michigan University in 2006 with a degree in accounting, **Chris Janczewski** spent 16 years working for the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Chris spent most of his time with the IRS as a special agent investigating international money laundering cases related to terrorism, state sponsored thefts by North Korea, darknet markets, and cryptocurrency. Between 2019 and 2023, Chris was featured in the Wall Street Journal, WIRED magazine, a best-selling book, and other outlets for his work in uncovering and shutting down the darknet's largest child exploitation website.

During his career, Chris has briefed the White House, members of the President's cabinet, members of the U.S. Congress, the United Nations, Harvard Law School, and others. He has also been quoted as a subject matter expert on live news broadcasts and international print media.

Chris was honored to receive the 2019 Meritorious Service Award from Secretary of the Treasury Steven Mnuchin. In 2020, Chris again was recognized by Secretary Mnuchin with the Secretary's Honor award. In addition, Chris was awarded the 2020 IRS Chief's Investigative Excellence Award and was twice a finalist (in 2020 and 2022) for the Samuel J. Hymen Service to America Medals.

In 2022, Chris left the IRS to join the fintech company TRM Labs where he leads a team of investigators on multiple continents supporting major law enforcement agencies around the world to investigate financial crimes. Chris's last investigation as a special agent led to the seizure of over \$3.6 billion dollars, the largest in U.S. government history.

After moving multiple times for the government, Chris, his wife Jill, son Dayton, and daughter Sloane, have settled in Grand Rapids.



# BPA 2022-2023 HAPPENINGS

**Swan Valley Business Professionals of America (BPA)** was established in 2000, and has been at the cutting edge of business professionalism within our community since its establishment. The first year of our chapter included eight students, a number which has increased significantly over the years. Under the leadership of Mrs. Dawn Perez and Mrs. Kristin Palmer our chapter has grown to record sizes within the Michigan Association, and has received innumerable awards.



Students in BPA are given the opportunity to compete in over 90 workplace skills events. These events take place at the regional, state, and national levels, and provide both a challenging and a rewarding experience for our members. Both individual and small group events are available in these diverse competitions. In the past twenty-three years, Swan Valley BPA members have participated in the state competition every year with a multitude of our students placing.

At this year's state competition in Grand Rapids, Michigan, we had many students who managed to qualify. Despite the competition having involved thousands of students in the state, our organization had nine students qualify for the national competition. This represents that they placed top 2 for group events or top 7 for individual events. It takes incredible skill and hard work in order to place in these events.

Moving forward to the national competition, our organization had 7 students who took the trip to Anaheim, California. Despite the several thousand students who attended across 25 states, we had 5 of our own students stand up on the stage. One of the students, **Keegan Palmer**, placed 6th in *Fundamental Word Processing*, which was an incredible feat as freshmen in high school. Moreover, our other four students: (left to right in picture) **Nathan Coffel, Kiersten Schiebner, Rose Campbell, and Ethan Brooks**, placed second for the *Administrative Support Team* and were able to stand up on the podium. In order to place



at the national level, it requires even more skill and determination than the state competition due to the caliber of students at the national level.

In addition to their participation in competitions, BPA members participate in the Torch Awards program. This program combines elements from seven different fields to create a virtual resume of students' achievements and service. Torch Awards are awarded at four levels (in order): Executive, Diplomat,

Statesman, and Ambassador. Dozens of students from Swan Valley have received Torch Awards. This year's National Torch Awards showcased **Demi Buckley, Keegan Palmer, and Liam Sharpe**. All three of these students have achieved the Ambassador level. This impressive feat was noted in the national competition at California.

This year's officer team consists of **President-Ethan Brooks, Vice President-Kiersten Schiebner, Treasurer-Brian Booth, Secretary-Elliana Johnson, Historian-Allison Krawczak, and Parliamentarian-Jordan Everett**.

This year's Swan Valley BPA has been a year that will never be forgotten. These current students have paved the way for more students to succeed and explore their interests in business related areas. ## Class of 2023 Offered Over \$5 Million in Scholarships

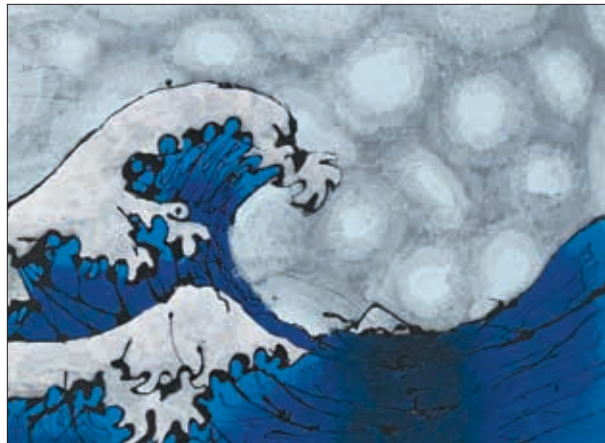

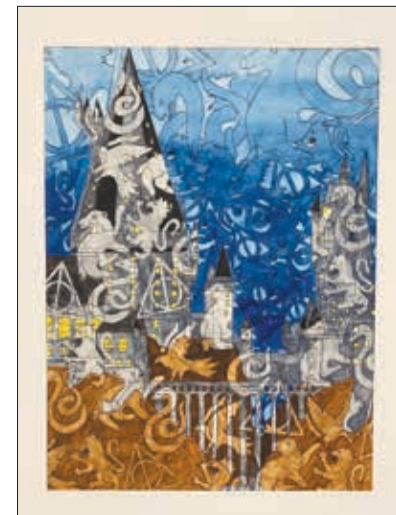
# SVHS Art Show



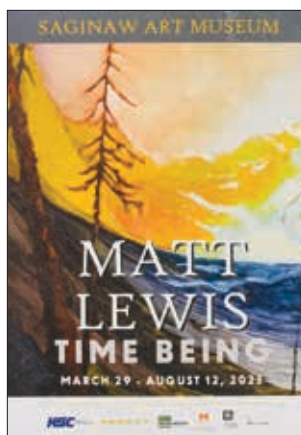

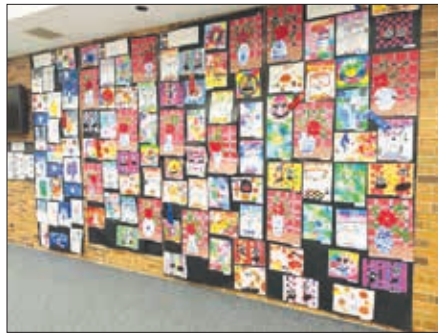

8th graders visited and worked with 5th grade students on a STEM experiment.



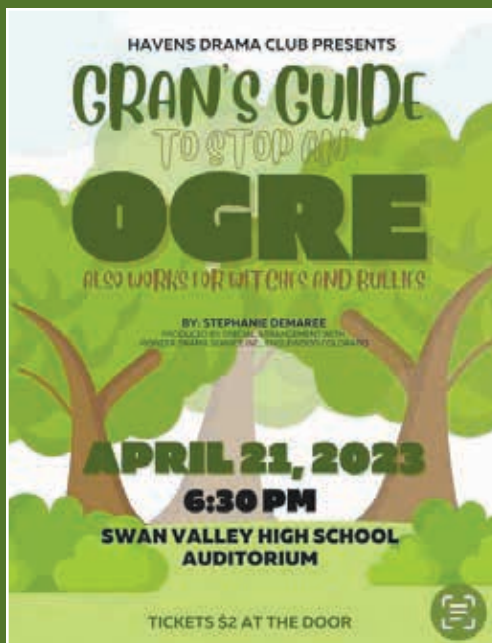
## Loons Game
