# 1. OPENING AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

## 2. REPORTS

#### **Jefferson Street Project** 2.a.

Davey & Assoc. Engineers Information

Representatives from Davey and Associates Engineering and CORE Engineering Group explained that, through CDBG Funds, the City is developing plans for the extension of Jefferson Street from Somerton Avenue to Carlisle Avenue adjacent to Somerton Middle School, and for improvement of the intersection of Jefferson Street and Somerton Avenue. This project will necessitate some reworking of the driveways for the Middle School and reconfiguration of traffic flow. The Board mentioned the serious parking problems that exist for AWC evening classes and the impact that installation of curbs, gutters and sidewalks might create if access to the retention basins is eliminated. Mr. Klein mentioned working with AWC to add parking in the areas where the houses were demolished. Street lighting will also be a part of this project. The District has committed approximately \$35,000 for this project. Once the design is completed it will come back to the Board for approval.

#### 2.b. Proposed Accommodation School

#### Information

#### Tom Tyree, Yuma County School Superintendent, and Judge Kongable

Yuma County School Superintendent. Tom Tyree and Juvenile Judge Kongable briefed the Board on discussions that have taken place for an alternative for those sixth, seventh and eighth grade students who have either been long-term suspended or expelled from the District. According to the law it is the parents responsibility to insure that the student is in school, however there are limited alternatives for this if the student has been suspended or expelled. They are planning to have the school for 15 - 18 students. So far Crane School District and Yuma Elementary District have agreed to participate. The students would remain students in their school district, and the district would then pay the accommodation school for each seat. The Somerton District would purchase five seats in the school and it would be approximately \$8,000 per seat. The State funding would still come to the District for each of these students so this would offset some of that expense. Transportation would also be the responsibility for the sending District. Mr. Tyree thanked the Board for Mrs. Bobbitt's participation in this process.
