1.a. Call to Order

Mr. Heredia called the meeting to order at 5:10 p.m.

1.b. Pledge of Allegiance

1.c. Financial Services Presentation

Information

Ms. Witmer

Ms. Witmer distributed information to the Board regarding the process that is used for Request for Proposals. She highlighted the information contained in the RFP issued for Occupational Therapists on tonight's agenda for award.

Ms. Witmer prepared and outlined information the Board requested which included Maintenance and Operations, Federal Programs and Proposition 301 funds. Ms. Witmer also presented information on the projected revenue increases that will be seen in the M & O Budget section. She supplied information on what will be available, the new positions requested, the cost of opening the new school, as well as fixed increases.

Ms. Witmer reminded the Board that the M & O Budget is separate from our Federal Programs. In addition any positions currently funded through the M&O Budget must continue to be funded in the M&O Budget, and can not be transferred to a Federal Program Fund. In Special Education the District must also maintain the same level of funding per student for each special education student.

Ms. Witmer mentioned that administrators submitted lists of potential positions they could fill, if funding were available. Mr. Brick would like to address the Board, at a future meeting, to present his future staff needs. Ms. Witmer presented the fixed cost report showing increase in utilities. She recommended the Board set priorities in order for her to submit information they'd like to see in future reports. Some Districts have made cuts in their budget, by cutting all travel, some supplies, or staffing. Ms. Witmer will research and find out what cuts may need to be put in place, if the District is faced with budget restrictions. Mr. Heredia suggested a report that shows where funds are being distributed and how they're used. To save on cost, Ms. Witmer explained that the District purchases some items in bulk and distributes those items from its warehouse.

Ms. Witmer said that after the budget is presented to administrators, they will have to see what positions can be funded for the new school. If an estimation of staff is made from the number of classrooms at any given school, it would probably be incorrect, because some rooms are being used that were not originally going to be classrooms (ie: Music Room/Kindergarten Class or store rooms/classroom). Additional options will need to be explored.

4.01. Approve Occupational Therapist Contract for Remainder of 2004-05 School Year

4.08. Discussion, Information, and Possible Action on Joint use Agreement with the City of Somerton Regarding Facilities

Mr. Klein explained that this item of concern had been discussed at previous meetings. The Joint Use Agreement was approved November, 2002 and is valid until 2005 unless subsequent changes are made. The City will take care of the field's lighting and every six month the District and City have agreed to meet to discuss making the field operational and duties of each agency in relation to use of the field.

If events are not scheduled by the City or an organized City league the group is charged for lighting. (Mr. Omer arrived at 7:20 p.m.). Mr. Heredia suggested payment be collected at the City and/or District Office when City events are being scheduled. The District will discuss arrangements with the City. The District will review the practice of asking for a Certificate of Insurance from private groups. The District wants to assure understanding of liability with groups using the facility. The Board asked for Staff to look in to what procedures other schools use.

Mr. Phillips noted that the areas should be monitored so that the public is not drinking or doing something else on the premises that could be negatively reflected on the District.

The Board agreed to bring this matter to the table at the next Board Meeting for further discussion.

4.10. CALL FOR EXECUTIVE SESSION Mr. Heredia

A.R.S. §38-431.03 Executive Sessions

- Upon a public majority vote of the members constituting a quorum, a public body may hold an executive session but only for the Α. following purposes:
 - Discussion or consideration of employment, assignment, appointment, promotion, demotion, dismissal, salaries, disciplining or resignation of a public officer, appointee or employee of any public body, except that, with the exception of salary discussions, an officer, appointee or employee may demand that the discussion or consideration occur at a public meeting. The public body shall provide the officer, appointee or employee with written notice of the executive session as is appropriate but not less than twenty-four hours for the officer, appointee or employee to determine whether the discussion or consideration of the discussion or employee. 1. consideration should occur at the public meeting. Discussion or consultation for legal advice with the attorney or attorneys of the public body.
