## Monthly Revenue/Expense



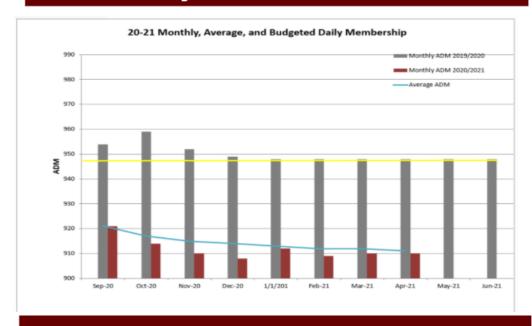
