

Next Steps A & Next Steps B

Specialized Instruction

The specialized instruction in the Next Steps Program is centered around four, essential models of instruction that are the foundational building block of learning:

1) Learning Behavior

Direct Instruction Exploration—Doing Mastery Learning

2) Information Processing Skills

Listening-Responding Questioning Concept Development

3) Personal Development

Self-Concept/Self-Esteem Self-Direction Independence Creativity and Curiosity

4) Social Interaction

Cooperative Learning Role Playing Sharing—Leading Individualized, direct instruction and opportunities for age-appropriate integration
