Superintendent Williams:

- Tomorrow begins testing for juniors taking the SAT, followed by PSAT, and M-STEP, etc...
- April is Child Abuse Prevention Month: On Thursday, April 25th at 11 am, the Michigan Children's Trust Fund (CTF), will host its 11th annual Child Abuse Prevention Awareness Day event at the State Capitol Building and rally, procession and planting of a pinwheel "garden".

Assistant Superintendent Cyr:

I have been working with the TFT President to work through the creation of explicit detail, protocols and
procedures for the District Site Steering Committee, the Elementary Curriculum Team, The Secondary
Curriculum Team, and the Instructional Curriculum Committee. Once this draft document is created, it will
be shared with the BOE to include NEOLA policies and/or regulations.

- Collections Pilot at the Middle Schools Met with the middle school English teachers to discuss their
 experience with the <u>Collections</u> pilot. This completes the comprehensive K-12 ELA aligned curriculum.
 The vast majority, 7 out of 8 teachers were supportive of moving to the next level in the SCT/ICC process.
 If the pilot is supported, 31a funds will be used.
