2 REPORTS/PRESENTATIONS

2.01 Superintendent's/Asst. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent's Report:

- The current unofficial pupil account is 6366. This is a shortfall of approximately 80-90 students (\$650,000 \$700,000) what was projected and budgeted for. We are continuing to compress our staffing profile through attrition as much as possible.
- The final Kennedy homecoming was a great success. Thank you to all of the secretaries, faculty and support staff who helped to organize all facets of the prep for the game and dance.
- T-Mobile lease discussion Continuing to work on the proposal with T-Mobile and will update the board as soon as the final draft is complete.
- Working with Concordia University in Ann Arbor to partner with them and TSD to allow any
 employees to take advantage of a 24% tuition discount on select graduate programs and
 endorsement areas in the field of education.
- Two elementary schools have partnered with Delta Dental to submit grants to have some existing water fountains replaces with combo water fountain/bottle filling stations. The grant covers the cost

- of the new devices, and if awarded, our local maintenance and electricians will perform the install. The grant is offered by Delta Dental and MESSA. More schools are working on the grants as well.
- Beaumont and Congresswoman Dingell's office are working to set up a town hall for students to address the ongoing opioid crisis. They are partnering with Senator Kennedy from Massachusetts and together they want to host the town hall here in Taylor next Wednesday, October 18th. Details are still being arranged.
- High School Merger Meeting Last week the committee met and summarized the work that took
 place at the first merger committee meeting, introduced Dr. Green as our project manager, and
 began to look at some updated information in the area of costs of expansions and/or replacement for
 new uniforms, gym floor, scoreboard, and exterior improvements to the athletic complex. We also
 looked at some interior costs for repainting the interior of Truman. The next meeting is scheduled for
 October 11th and will be posted as an open meeting for the community.
- Interviewed with the News Herald to give an update on the high school merger process and the high school re-design and that once the board receives and reviews feedback from all of the stakeholder groups, that the board will be making the decision about whether or not to rename Truman High School.
- Strategic Planning Working with Dr. Rod Green on the initial draft proposal for strategic planning. Once the dates are confirmed with the board, we will begin planning this important work.
