Hope all of you had a relaxing week off from school responsibilities. Hard to believe that May is just around the corner. With it comes many special year end events. They may look a bit different this year but we are happy to be able to celebrate them even if in a slightly different way. This is a good reason to keep up the good work in following safety guidelines.

Below are some frequently asked questions that will help guide you through the next few weeks.


I received a letter from school about a positive case in my child's class. Do I need to have him/her tested? **No.** [This letter is designed as an FYI so that if your child develops symptoms you will be more vigilant about getting them tested.](#)

My child tested positive. What do I do next? [Notify the school nurse and your child's health care provider. Early notification helps to minimize the spread of the virus by quarantining any close contacts with your child.](#)

My child is in quarantine. If they test negative, can they return to school? [Yes after day 7 of their quarantine if they tested negative. Send the results to the school nurse so she may clear them to be in class.](#)

My child had some symptoms on the Covid 19 morning screening form. I had him/her tested. Can I send them to school after the test? [You may send your child to school **after** you receive the negative PCR results and their symptoms have improved and they have been fever free without medication for 24 hours.](#)

My child was a close contact to a positive case. What should I do? [Contact your child's health care provider and school nurse teacher. The RIDOH has been overwhelmed with positive cases and may not be able to reach you to give you guidance.](#)



I have one child in school who has symptoms on the Covid 19 screening list. Does this affect my other children in the school district? **Yes.** [Your other children should stay out of school until you receive the test results for your ill child.](#)

If I have one child with one symptom on the Covid 19 screener list, do I keep my other children home? **It would depend on the symptom.** [If the child has a cough, loss of taste and/or smell or difficulty breathing, then they should all stay home. If the child has any other one symptom they should be monitored and the other children may attend school.](#)

I was a close contact of a positive person. Does my child need to stay home? **No.** [They are considered a contact of a contact. If you were to develop symptoms then they would need to stay home.](#)

- Make up testing for SAT is scheduled for April 29 in the media center
 - Make up testing for PSAT is scheduled for May 3rd in the media center
 - If you are a student that needs a make up test, information has been emailed to you. Please check your email.
 - All students are to report to their testing rooms promptly by 7.15 am. Testing will start at 7.30 am.
 - Both tests are digital so please ensure to bring your school issued chromebook fully charged that day. To be safe, please carry your charger in your backpack in case your battery runs out during testing.
 - Students will be asked to place all their electronic devices including iphones, iwatches, and all other belongings in their backpacks. Students will be asked to place their backpacks in front of the room until testing is completely over and all materials have been collected. Use of electronic devices is strictly prohibited by the College Board. Any violation can lead to cancellation of scores.
 - Calculators are built into the digital platform of the test. If you prefer using a handheld calculator, see approved list of calculators [HERE](#)
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- Breakfast and lunch will be available for grab and go as always in school. We will also provide water and light snacks during testing breaks in the hallways outside the testing rooms
 - Students should get a good night's sleep prior to the test day.

Public School Students: It is expected that students attending public school in Rhode Island will participate in the required tests for their current grade level. Public school students are expected to participate in the PSAT 10 administration in grade 10, and the SAT School Day or the alternate assessments in grade 11.

[NGSA \(Next Generation Science Assessment\)](#) **


- NGSA (Next Generation Science Assessment) is administered to all juniors by the State of RI, Department of Education. This test is mandatory for all juniors to attempt.
 - The test is scheduled for Wednesday April 28, 2021.
 - All other grade levels (9, 10 and 12) will be DL. Most teachers will be able to connect synchronously with their students at home that day unless they are proctoring the test or their room is being used for testing. Teachers will post lessons according and inform students.
 - Only juniors will be attending school that day for testing.
 - NGSA is a digital test so please ensure to bring your school issued chromebook fully charged that day. To be safe, please carry your charger in your backpack in case your battery runs out during testing.
 - For any students needing a loaner chromebook that day, please report to the media center to sign one out for the day by 7 am to ensure you can be in your testing room by 7.15 am
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- Students will be asked to place all their electronic devices including iphones, iwatches, and all other belongings in their backpacks. Students will be asked to place their backpacks in front of the room until testing is completely over and all materials have been collected.
 - Students will arrive at school at the normal time for the test. All students are expected to report to their testing rooms by 7.15 am. Test will begin at 7.30 am. The test will end around 11.30am and students will be dismissed at that time. Buses will be available at 11.30 for those that normally ride the bus. The drop off to school time for the busses will remain the same
 - Juniors driving to school that day will be able to park in the upper and lower student lots on a first come first basis. Under no circumstances can students park in staff parking lots.
 - Breakfast and lunch will be available for grab and go as always in school.
 - Next week on Monday (April 26) and Tuesday (April 27), please check with your first period teacher for your testing room. They have been provided with this information.
 - Students should get a good night's sleep prior to the test day.

One very important factor that was taken into consideration was a restrictive format within the digital exam which would prevent the student from going back to previous questions and also prevent students from reviewing their answers. The inability to review, correct or make changes within the test puts students using the digital format at a disadvantage.
