DECA Rhode Island State Career Development Conference

At the closing awards ceremony for the DECA International Career Development Conference on Thursday, May 6th, *Nicholas Chabot*, a student at North Kingstown High School and a long standing member of NK's DECA Chapter, was awarded a \$103,824 scholarship from the US Army and Army ROTC. Many other students from around the country and Canada were awarded sizable scholarships from DECA sponsors with Nick representing Rhode Island. *Nick* will be attending the University of Tampa.

DECA International Career Conference

This year 27 members who earned qualifying scores at the statewide conference competed at DECA's International Career Development conference - 27 in total against a backdrop of over 20,000 student members, internationally. Congratulations to the 27 for earning this honor! The conference, originally to be held in Anaheim, was conducted virtually, but with a rigorous 3 week agenda that also included educational and leadership growth sessions. There are gifts to be awarded to each member in May!

Rhode Island's Financial Literacy Challenge

Each year Jump\$start Rhode Island, the treasurer's office, and the Economic Council for Education hosts the state-wide literacy challenge where student teams from each school compete for top positions based on exams averaged among team members. This year, NKHS took first place tied with East Greenwich High School! The team of *Will Medeiros, Owen Moynihan, Sean Dempsey, and Nolan Trask* are now in their finalist competition to break the tie... with winners moving on to the nationals hosted by the University of Nebraska. Whether they earn 1st or 2nd place this year... it's another trophy for NK's room 110 and another tribute of these students and to the talent this district represents!

SIFMA Stock Market Challenge:

Each year, our Personal Finance and Investment courses at the high school compete in the state-wide Stock Market Game hosted by major financial institutions. This year *Colin McBrier and Matthew Gibbs from Mr. Garland's* finance class earned 2nd place in the year long stock market challenge. They'll be recognized by the SIFMA organization in the upcoming months. Congratulations to these two NK seniors!

FREE Support to go to College!

The Rhode Island Department of Education (RIDE) and the Office of the Postsecondary Commissioner (OPC) are working on a new initiative to provide free college enrollment resources to the graduating Class of 2020. Many Rhode Island students have had their college plans disrupted by the pandemic and our goal is to provide these graduates with free information and support to re-start their path into college. School Day SAT and PSAT for Spring 2021 **

In Spite of the Pandemic, NKHS's participation rate for standardized testing held recently has remained high. We are so proud of our students and their continued perseverance through the challenges of this year. The completing rates are given below;

- 92% of NKHS Juniors participated in taking school day SATs.
- 86% of NKHS Sophomores participated in taking the school day PSATs.

Score Release

Current expected score delivery is:

Digital Testing Window	Student Scores Release Beginning On	Educator Scores Release Beginning On
April 13-15 – SAT	May 5	May 6
April 27-29 – SAT	May 20	May 21
April 13-May 5 - PSAT 10	May 10	May 11

NOTE: Some scores may be released later than the dates above because their tests were received after the regular scoring window or there was an exceptional condition that required additional attention or investigation. These scores will be released on a rolling basis, as the issues are resolved.

If a student is signed-in to their College Board account but doesn't see their scores, one of the reasons may be that we were not able to link their score report and account automatically. For security reasons, a student must verify additional information before we can display their scores. They will need either their SAT registration number (found in the roster report of the K-12 Reporting Portal) or the SASID they were pre-identified/registered with by RIDE.

To match, the student will:

- 1. Log in to their College Board account.
- 2. Scroll down and click the Matching **Tool**.
- 3. Review their personal information.
- 4. If any information is incorrect, click **Update** to revise. (Students will be prompted to re-enter their password.)
- 5. If the information is correct, click **Get My Scores**.
- 6. The student will have to select one of the following options:
- a) I can supply my test information (test date and registration number).
- b) I can supply my student ID (using the SASID the student was pre-identified with).

There may still be cases in which students won't be able to view their scores using the steps above because their information is inconsistent, the student has multiple College Board accounts, or their scores haven't been released yet. If students cannot view their scores, they should call the College Board's Student SAT Helpline at 866-756-7346.

SEAL of Biliteracy *

Message from NKHS's World Language DEpartment Chairperson Mr Mark DeLucia

It gives me great pleasure to announce the 2021 recipients of the RI Seal of Biliteracy. Along with the Commissioner's Seal and Pathway Endorsements, the Seal of Biliteracy is one of three council designations that a student can receive on a Rhode Island diploma. Students must demonstrate competence in both English and a world language through multiple measures.

In spite of a global pandemic and the academic challenges that accompanied it, our students once again rose to the occasion. Students proved their language abilities in all four languages offered at NKHS (plus Russian!). Students are tested in four different areas (Speaking, Reading, Writing and Listening) and then rated on a scale ranging from "Novice Low" (N1) to "Advanced Low" (A1), the highest possible on this exam (see scale below). Students achieving A1 will receive "Gold" status, while those receiving "Intermediate Mid", the minimum required, will receive "Silver".

Here are our results by the numbers:

- 58 students passed the Biliteracy exam or AP Spanish Language exam as juniors in order to earn the seal
- 47 of those students are members of the class of 2021 and 11 are underclassmen
- 24 students (19 seniors) received "Gold" status, meaning they achieved a level of "Advanced Low", the highest possible on the exam.
- 37 students achieved a score of "Advanced Low" (A1) on at least one section.
 - This is particularly impressive, as Advanced Low is the status usually given to undergraduate language majors. For context, this is the minimum passing score for aspiring language teachers.

I would also like to publicly acknowledge the skillful teaching of the NKHS World Language Department, English Department, ELL teachers throughout the district, and the World Language

faculty of Davisville and Wickford Middle Schools and the Jamestown Lawn School. Thank you for all that you do for our students.

Additionally, a tremendous thank you to all who support what we do, but especially NKHS faculty, the leadership team at NKHS, WMS, DMS, Dr. Auger, Dr. Mancieri, and the North Kingstown School Committee.

Message from RI Commissioner of Education-Support for students during Pandemic

The pandemic has impacted every aspect of our lives, in particular, student learning. Fortunately, there's a solution available to help struggling students catch up, and it's been around for millennia: tutoring.

RIDE is excited to announce this week an innovative partnership with Sal Khan, founder of Khan Academy and Schoolhouse.world. <u>Schoolhouse.world</u> is a new online platform from Sal Khan, the founder of Khan Academy, that matches students around the world with free tutors. The tutors provide small-group math and SAT prep tutoring for students in grades 6-12, building on the Khan Academy curriculum. Rhode Island is one of two state-level partnerships offering this opportunity to students across the state. Registration is now live on the All Course Network (ACN) and <u>students can sign up here on EnrollRI</u>. There is no deadline for students to sign up (though schools will still need to approve their enrollment via the ACN), no cost to LEAs or students, and no requirement to participate.
