HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2018

- Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to seniors attending Beaverhead County High School this year.
- If qualified, at least one of the scholarships will be awarded to an individual who is the child, or grandchild of a veteran or a current member of the US Armed Services.
- An individual applying for the scholarship based on their relationship to a veteran, will provide information on the branch of service, dates of service of the veteran or military member that qualifies them for this scholarship, and any disabilities of the veteran or military member.
- The application process will begin immediately and applications must be turned into VFW Post 9040 by April 9, 2018. Applications may be turned in to Mrs. Bertleson, high school counselor, by this date.
- The application will consist of the individual's name, a list of their high school, extracurricular, and community service activities, and a 250-350 word essay on the topic of "Why Honor the American Flag".
 - Each essay will be formatted as follows
 - Each side margin should be 1 inch wide.
 - Leave a top margin of 1 inch.
 - On two separate, single spaced lines in the upper right hand corner of each page: the applicant's name and the date. Align these two lines to the left with the longest line ending at the right hand margin.
 - The title should be centered on the third line below the date.
 - The body of the essay should begin on the third line below the title and lines should be double spaced.
 - On a separate page following the essay, applicant should list their high school, extracurricular, and community service activities.
 - If applying for the scholarship award based on the applicant's relationship to a member of the military or veteran, information on the branch of service, dates of service, and any disabilities of the veteran or service member should follow the list of high school and community service activities.
- The application will be submitted in a clear plastic report cover.
