

Hangouts Meet features for remote working and learning are now available

Dear G Suite for Education Administrator,

This notice is a follow up to our previous email regarding access to premium Meet features, and an update on new Meet features available for education users. See below for instructions to set up access for your domain.

Confirmation of access to premium Meet features

The following premium Meet features have now rolled out to all domains, and you'll have access to them until **July 1, 2020**:

- [Increased participant limit of 250 participants per video call](#)
- [Live stream a video call](#) (up to 100,000 viewers within a domain)
- [Record a video call](#)

Important: As the livestream and recording settings will be default off, you must enable them in the Google Admin Console to allow your users to access them. To limit access, only enable these premium features for your faculty and staff. For instructions on how to set up these features, visit the [Set up Meet for distance learning page](#).

Hangouts Meet improvements for remote learning

Thanks to feedback from educators around the globe, we've started rolling out new features to Hangouts Meet. We expect the features to be rolled out to all G Suite for Education and G Suite Enterprise for Education domains over the next 2 - 3 weeks.

Improved meeting control features: 'mute' and 'remove'

For education users, we're only allowing the meeting creator, meeting calendar owner, or person who sets up a meeting on an in-room hardware device to mute or remove other participants in a meeting. This means that if a teacher creates the meeting or owns the calendar the meeting was created on, students can't remove or mute other students.

Improved teacher controls for nicknamed meetings

Participants will not be able to re-join a meeting after the final participant has left if:

- The meeting was created using a short link like [g.co/meet/nickname](#)
- The meeting was created at [meet.google.com](#) by entering a meeting nickname in the "Join or start a meeting" field
- The meeting was created in the Meet app by entering a nickname in the "Meeting code" field

This means if the teacher is the last person to leave these types of meetings, students cannot join later without the teacher.
