- Something Rotten: A fresh Look at Roadkill by Heather L. Montgomery (non-fiction)
- Inside Out & Back Again by Thanhha Lai

The required novel will be discussed within the first few weeks of school to focus on skills such as: character, plot, vocabulary, etc.

There will then be a whole novel test.
