Strategy #1	Strategy 1-Provide additional recess monitoring for student safety. Change recess cohort groups by decreasing from four grade levels per recess to only two. The decrease in student numbers at recess will decrease disciplinary referrals and increase instructional time.
Strategy #2	Strategy 2 - Increase well-rounded learning opportunities for all students by increasing elective course offerings. The course offerings will be rooted in engagement feedback from students, families, and partnering organizations. This may require hiring new staff or adjusting current assignmnets of the teaching staff.
Strategy #3	Strategy 3 - Adopt Aptegy to increase family engagement and communication. The new platform will allow for a more integrated approach for communicating with families and sharing information in multiple methods simultaneously. We anticipate an increase in family engagement by providing families with multiple methods of accessing information and new opportunities for communicating with the school district.

Strategy #4	Strategy 4 - Increase student and family access to behavior and mental health counseling by increasing the current availability to a full-time counselor. Adequate space for counseling services will be provided to allow for consistent and private counseling support. Currently, there is not a consistent location for meeting with the counselor and often meeting spaces are not in a location best for confidentiality.
