After determining that a quorum was present, the January 18, 2018 meeting of the BUSD Board of Trustees was called to order by President Trina Orrill at 6:33pm.

Taylor Ludwick announced that a former Bishop High School Graduate, Melody Lawrence, has been accepted at UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine.

  - 5.2.1 Heather Carr/Dr.Gretchen Skrotzki, Bishop Elementary School Principal Josh Nicholson asked about feedback from teachers in regards to the Peer Teaching program. HC said most are really enjoying it and finding it useful. A few are still not comfortable with having their peers in their classroom.

Taylor Ludwick – how is the 5<sup>th</sup> grade team doing in regards to their concerns last year over class sizes. HC said they are doing great, students are well behaved and doing well. TL – what is the status of the enrichment programs? HC – so far we have a running club and there will be more to come in the near future.

# 5.2.2 Patrick Twomey/Derek Moisant, Home Street Middle School Principal

DM – school climate is still low key after the Winter Break. Recent Wild Iris presentation low attendance was disappointing.

Josh Nicholson asked whatever happened to the idea of reconfiguring the parking in front of HSMS. BS – lost momentum and dropped. Will revisit.

#### 5.2.3 Katie Kolker, Palisade Glacier High School Principal

KK – WASC report is finished. The WASC committee will be on campus February 5<sup>th</sup>. The size of PGHS is unusually small for an alternative education school.

#### 5.2.4 Randy Cook/Dave Kalk, Bishop Union High School Principal

RC recognized recent discipline issues on the boys soccer team. The athletic committee took action and removed players involved. RC and others have notice a huge improvement in the other athletes attitudes and performance. DK stated the action taken set the tone for all sport teams. RC – Don Rowan is doing a great job with ASB. He has made changes and is working on leadership curriculum. Teachers Candice Tonseth, Sasha Green and Angela Owens are helping with ASB and are good leaders.

Taylor Ludwick asked the status of the Plasma Cutter. RC – still in the works, having issues with dig alert. Should be resolved soon.

Josh Nicholson commented that just watching the boys soccer team in recent pre-game warm ups showed good discipline.

Question directed at Stacy Van Nest (Athletic Director) why no JV Soccer? She explained other schools in our league do not have JV teams to compete against. A JV Girls basketball team didn't exist this year due to low numbers.

#### 5.3 Barry Simpson, BUSD Superintendent

#### 5.3.1 Attendance / Enrollment

Enrollment remains strong at 1963. Attendance is a little low at 93% and we haven't experienced the peak of flu season yet. Adding 1% would add over \$100,000 to our budget.

#### 5.3.2 Governor's Budget Proposals

This will be Governor Brown's final budget and it is expected that he will get the vast majority of his proposals. Proposals include 3.1 billion in ongoing money to school districts which fully funds LCFF 2 years ahead of schedule. KZ made note that this sounds good to the public but they need to understand that this only results in reaching what has been determined to be a necessary minimum funding level and in no way sufficiently funds our schools. This still leaves us well below average in the nation for school funding. If we were funded at the average it would be transformative for our program.

BS – in addition, there will be 1.8 billion in one-time money given to schools. This means approximately \$295 dollars per student or over \$500,000. Nothing in the budget addresses the PERS/STRS increases which are a big concern.

#### 5.3.3 LCAP Survey

Rough draft for parent survey is ready for review. Our goal is to increase the number of parents who take the survey. Will have computers available in school offices where parents can conveniently access and take the survey.
