

WHAT IS POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS (PBS)?

TIER 1 SCHOOLWIDE

- PBS is a research-based, school-wide system approach to improve school climate which creates safer and more effective schools.
- PBS IS A PROCESS. PBS is <u>NOT</u> a program or a curriculum.
- The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach expectations and support positive behavior for <u>all</u> students.
- PBS provides systems for schools to design, implement, and evaluate effective school-wide, classroom, nonclassroom, and student-specific discipline plans.
- PBS is a team-based process for data review, data-based problem solving and intervention, on-going planning, and monitoring of intervention.
- PBS is a <u>multi-tiered system</u> approach to intervention with three (3) tiers.
- Tier 1 interventions are universal and for all students.

WHAT ARE TIER 2 TARGETED INTERVENTIONS?

- When students need additional support, students are referred for Tier 2 Targeted Interventions.
- The goal is to provide extra support to these students to be successful both academically and behaviorally.
- A variety of students qualify for Tier 2
 Interventions including those who may
 be withdrawn as well as those students
 who display behaviors externally.
- All interventions are data-driven, evidenced—based and have been showed to produce positive results on student behavior.
- These interventions are for groups of students and there are 2 types of interventions at the Tier 2 Targeted level.
- Relationship building interventions are appropriate for students who seek adult attention and need an extra support.
- Check-In, Check-Out (CICO) is a relationship building intervention

- where students have an adult who they check in with and then check out with at the end of the day who provides positive support.
- Skill building interventions are appropriate for students who need to
- learn new skills and replacement behaviors.
- Social skill and anger management groups are conducted to teach students new skills.

WHAT ARE TIER 3 INTERVENTIONS?

- After students complete Tier 2
 interventions with little to no
 improvement, Tier 3 interventions are
 implemented.
- These interventions are individualized to meet the specific needs of each student.
- Tier 3 interventions include conducting a Functional Behavior Assessment (FBA) and Behavior Support Plan (BSP).
