

HSBP = CREDIT

Effective Starting 2016-17

CREDITS

All high school students are eligible to receive .25 high school elective credits per year as part of successfully completing their Naviance HSBP and district noted requirements via the scope and sequence; resulting in up to a 1.0 total elective credits earned for Career & College Readiness.

High School & Beyond Plan HSBP

1. Each grade level 9-12 has a HSBP with specific graduation requirements
2. All student will be granted .25 high school credits each year of successful completion of their HSBP and district requirements noted on the grade level scope and sequence linked via Naviance
3. Credits awarded will be based on Credit/No Credit criteria

GRADING

1. Students will automatically be awarded the .25 high school elective credits per year **UNLESS**
2. Students are noted as failing or refusing to complete HSBP tasks and district assignments
 - a. Students will be offered a reasonable amount of time to complete unmet tasks and assignments for their current academic year only
3. Students failing to successfully complete tasks and assignments will be graded as NO CREDIT and will not be eligible to receive the .25 high school elective credit for that academic year
4. School Counselors will be responsible for reviewing and grading any students who fall into NO CREDIT status

ROUTINE CHECKS

1. Each high school principal will be responsible for designating a method by which routine progress checks of student completion status will be conducted including identifying the staff responsible for conducting the checks

2. Routine checks need to occur at a minimum every other month September - February and every month March - June to assure students are on track with the completion of their HSBP requirements and district assignments
 - a. Progress report checks can be completed via the Naviance system for groups or individuals
3. Students falling behind on assignments should be notified immediately and a plan to put in place to complete missing assignments and tasks

HSBP = Graduation

1. Students must complete all elements of their HSBP as specified by grade level in order to graduate
2. Students failing to complete all of the HSBP grade level and district requirements will not receive credit as noted above **AND**
3. Failing students will not be permitted to graduate until all HSBP requirements have been successfully completed
4. Students who are not granted credit, but still wish to graduate by completing all tasks and assignments must make arrangements with their building principal and school counselor to create a plan for completing all necessary HSBP elements still outstanding
 - a. The building principal will have final approval of all graduation plans pertaining to the HSBP completion outside of the regular academic school year resulting in allowing a student to graduate

STARTING POINT

1. Students enrolling in the Marysville School District are expected to start their HSBP tasks and assignments at the month of entry into the district, and continue forward from that point
 - a. Awarding of credit will be based upon the same student seat time criteria as any other credit
2. Students are not expected to go back and make up any missing HSBP requirements if they enroll later in the school year
 - a. Example: student enrolls November of their junior year. The student starts the HSBP in November and continues on through June.
