- ★ Provide parents with timely information on curriculum, assessments, and proficiency levels.
- ★ Consistently monitor student performances to help provide the best instruction possible.
- ★ Engage in positive, frequent two-way communication with parents and families.
- ★ Encourage parents to check their child's grades and attendance on Aspire SIS.
- ★ Conduct needs assessments annually, as well as use data to set improvement goals for the school year.
- ★ Engage in professional development to learn best educational practices.
- ★ Facilitate student-educator-parent (SEP) conferences at least twice a year.
- ★ Provide parents an opportunity to observe and participate in classroom and school-wide activities.
- ★ Conduct an annual Back to School Night to explain Title I, resources, support available, and the school's goals.
