



- In K-6, there are two integrated ENL classes per grade level
- ENL teachers co-teach during literacy (K-6) and math workshop (K-1 and expanding K-3 next year)
- ENL teachers also provide Stand Alone ENL services for students who require it
- 6th grade math is taught by dual certified ENL teachers





- In the middle school, we offer Integrated ELA and Social Studies along with Stand Alone ENL
- In the high school, we offer Integrated English 9-12, Integrated Algebra and Business Math, Integrated Living Environment, and Integrated Global 10 and U.S. History
- We also offer Principles of Living Environment for newcomers and we are excited to offer Principles of Algebra next year
- Additionally, we offer content area support workshops for Social Studies, Algebra, and Living Environment
- New this year is Spanish for Native Speakers and next year we will offer Spanish for Native Speakers II
- These courses provide a pathway for ELLs to achieve the NYS Seal of Biliteracy on their diploma




- When a student transfers from another New York State school, we contact them for the student's language proficiency scores
- If a student is new to the country or comes from another state, they follow the guidelines shown



- Numbers each year indicate total number of ELLs served by the district
- Once a student is on our roster for 10 days or more, they are reflected in our ELL count
- Typically, the ELL population is transient, but our population is stable
- Likely to exceed last year's number





- ELL students' Regents scores have consistently improved over the past few years Our variety of Integrated content area courses with accompanying workshops support student growth and success




- The NYSESLAT is the annual language assessment exam taken by all active ELLs in grades K-12
- The exam assesses student's' proficiency in reading, writing, listening, and speaking and is given over four days in the spring
- Our students' performance on the annual NYSESLAT exam continues to improve and students are scoring at the highest proficiency levels
- Last year, we exited 38 students




- Students can exit ENL by scoring Commanding on the NYSESLAt exam OR by scoring Expanding plus earning a 3 on the ELA or a 65 or more on the English regents
- Former ELLs are mandated to receive monitoring services (minimum of 90 minutes per week) by a certified ENL teacher
- We are currently servicing 194 active ELLS and 39 monitored students


Models of Co-Teaching Best Practices

- Administrators and teachers from the Wake County Public Schools in North Carolina spent the morning at Cornwell Avenue observing and debriefing with the team












- The West Hempstead ENL Department has been featured in three recent texts published by Dr. Honigsfeld, Dr. Dove, and Dr. Cohan













- The ENL Department is proud to be the leaders in bringing Harvard Project Zero Thinking Routines to classrooms across the district

Project Based Learning






- Project Based Learning is an excellent way to provide multiple entry points for all students while encouraging communication and collaboration

- This is an ongoing initiative that will continue to expand each year





 Students discuss struggles and successes and they learn about planning for their future in WHHS and after graduation




 Every year, graduates return to share words of wisdom and suggestions for success with our current ELLs during various events held at the high school

- Students fundraise to support trips and other initiatives selected by the club members









- Ms. Cordeiro is working with co-teaching teams to enhance collaborative practices and develop students' oral language skills
