

End of the Year Health Report

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OVERVIEW

The 2020-2020 School Nurse End of Year Report includes data collected from each building in the district with the purpose of providing a cumulative picture of school nursing services.

ILLNESS/INJURIES

In the elementary, a total of 142 students were sent home throughout the year due to sickness (fever, vomiting, diarrhea, etc.) and a total of 44 were sent home in the high school. (These students were seen in my office)

SUMMARY OF SERVICES

- E-School is used to maintain confidential health records as well as individual student's health folders in the Nurses office.
- Services are provided for students with Special Health Care Needs.
- Promote compliance with Arkansas Immunization Requirements and Provide communicable disease control.
- Emergency nursing services plans developed and implemented in the schools, including staff training and delegation when needed, medication administration, referral and follow ups.
- Participate in Vision, Hearing, Scoliosis and BMI screening process and follow-up.
- Provide health education for students, families and staff to promote healthy lifestyles and responsible decision-making regarding matters affecting health and wellness.

IMMUNIZATIONS

There were a total of 19 students with immunization exemptions

There were a total of 41 students that tested positive for COVID-19

TEACHING

Teaching provided to students this year included

- **Smile Smart (DR. Tipton): Teaching on brushing, flossing, plaque and etc. He provided toothbrush kits that were handed out. (Preschool-3rd)**
- **Vaping Presentation: Presented by the Garland County Health Department to the High School Students (7th-12th)**

SCREENINGS

277 Students were screened for Vision, with 17 being referred to an eye doctor.

277 Students were screened for hearing, with 3 being referred to a physician

177 Students were screened for BMI. (12th grade was exempt this year)

177 Students were screened for scoliosis (12th grade was exempt this year)

CHRONIC MEDIAL CONDITIONS

When a student has a chronic medical condition, a care plan is created and kept in their medical folder in the nurse's office. Also, any information the student's teacher may need to know such as signs/symptoms to look for and what should be done, is provided. If classroom modifications are needed, I can sit in on a 504 meeting to get those modifications implemented into the student's plan.
