A) *Early Childhood and PAT*

Early Childhood Report

Enrollment for the year was reported: Frankfort Preschool - 23; Frankfort Kinder Prep - 18; Centralia Preschool - 19; Centralia Kinder Prep - 24). Projected Kindergarten Enrollment for 2021-2022 is 21 students at Centralia and 21 students at Frankfort. This year, the program has focused heavily on phonemic awareness. After meeting with the Steering Committee, we will also focus on print concepts and letter naming and letter sound identification with automaticity in the coming year, which is defined as within five seconds. Community involvement will continue to be a focus for next year with planned events such as a Donuts with Dudes, Lunch with Ladies and Brownies with the Board.

Parents as Teachers Report

Participation numbers for the year were reported: Centralia families served - 9; Frankfort families served - 16; waitlist of 7 families. Home visits this year have been a mix of in-person and virtual depending upon the comfort level of the families. A PAT-Preschool Transition Day was conducted with great success for students who will be attending the preschool program next year. Playgroups resumed in April, and Story Hours have been scheduled during the summer at the Frankfort, Centralia, and Corning libraries. Parent and child aquatic group lessons will also be offered this summer. Other services offered by Parents as Teachers include vision, hearing, and health screenings along with social-emotional and academic screenings. These results are used to create individual plans of activities to support tailored growth and support for each child.

B) *Principals' Report*

KSHSAA ended their mask mandate May 1, 2021. Athletic physicals were completed on May 7. The elementary had a great time at their field day and FFA Kiddie Barnyard. The Hobby Days also went well with the kids learning new things. Jason Rugen will take care of football field. He is also going to donate some reseeding to the front of the school. I am going to have him reseed the playground once school is out. One of the janitors is having surgery at the end of May and we will need to hire summer help. I only need one more sophomore class sponsor and the supplementals will be filled.

Kansas assessments finished up at the end of April. Centralia High earned a high National ranking in 2021 Best High School, which U.S. News released this week. Vermillion schools also received the Kansas Department of Education Star recognition program awards. We were recognized in graduation, academically prepared for post-secondary success. Thanks to all the staff, students and parents who continue to strive for the best for our schools. School physicals were given by Centralia clinic free again this year for students who needed them for participation in athletics. Congratulations to groups and individuals at state music/band and to the forensics students for their performances at state. HS graduation is May 14th at 10:30, Eighth grade promotion is May 17th at 6:30 p.m. and Kindergarten promotion May 18th at 9:30 a.m. Alumni banquet will be May 29. 21 students are expected for kindergarten this next school year.

Trevor Ashcraft

Family Literacy Night was held on May 5th with 42 families in attendance. The Ages and Stages Questionnaire was administered to incoming kindergarten students; this data will be disaggregated and reported back to families over the next two weeks. A Sensory Path will be incorporated into the early childhood program to support social-emotional development of students. The teachers have been meeting with the principal to discuss instructional strategies including the use of anchor charts, activities to promote student automaticity in naming letters and provide letter sounds, and incorporating MTSS small groups at the preschool level. A meeting was also held with the new district social worker to devise a plan for working with students during dramatic play in order to support students' social interaction development. She will also work with teachers to provide tips on integrating social-emotional skills into daily lessons based on the observations she conducts. Finally, the Early Childhood building will receive 26 iPads from Centralia kindergarten in the fall as they transition to Chromebooks in the kindergarten setting.

C) *Curriculum Director Report*

On April 21, both K-12 buildings hosted a social-emotional presentation for parents to support mental health of teenagers. In the 2021-2022 school year, the district will transition from AIMSweb+ to FastBridge as the universal screening tool for identifying student academic gaps. This will incorporate a social-emotional screener replacing our current Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire. Most of the curricular materials for the 2021-2022 school year have been ordered, including the acquisition of additional teacher materials for the new elementary teacher. Per the technology schedule, chromebooks will be ordered at the end of June through the USDA grant providing a 35% return on the funds spent.

Finally, the History-Government-Social Studies assessment for the 2021-2022 school year will no longer be a standardized multiple-choice test. Teachers in those tested grades (4th, 7th, 11th) will work with a representative from Greenbush Education Service Center in the fall to prepare for the new inquiry-based project model to design outlines for the student projects and rubrics for assessing them. These scores will be entered through the EOYA report on the KSDE website.


