During the summer, please feel free to choose with your child(ren) **2** or more books of their choice on their reading level or beyond for extra credit in the fall.

In order to receive extra credit, students need to create a visual presentation (see project suggestions below) of their favorite scene from one or more of the books they chose **OR** type a 1 <u>full page</u> summary of the plot from each book including main characters. Students will receive credit for each activity turned in. Parents, please make sure the two choices are books that <u>your child has not read before</u>. (Graphic Novels are acceptable and encouraged)

Island of the Blue Dolphins – O'Dell, Scott The Wingfeather Saga (4 books in series)

The Wonderful Wizard of Oz - Baum The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe (Lewis)

A Little Princes - Burnett Old Yeller by Fred Gipson

The Secret Garden – Burnett The Red Badge of Courage by Stephen Crane

Because of Winn Dixie - DiCamillo Jane Eyre by Charlotte Bronte (any of her books)

The Black Stallion - Farley Anne of Green Gables – L.M. Montgomery (any)

Hoot - Hiassen Alice in Wonderland by Lewis Carroll

## **Project Suggestions:**

Diorama – include explanation

Costume book for characters – 10 pages

Hand-painted mural depicting several scenes

Make a scroll with timeline of important events

Picture booklet with a minimum of 10 hand drawings

Full-color comic book, graphic novel – 10 pages

Movie – 3 – 5 minutes of YOU acting out a scene

Make a model of an important scene – with explanation

These are just suggestions. Use your imagination!

Drawings should be hand drawings NOT cut and paste from internet. No stick figures and no Legos.
