



Well Child Health Screening

Offered by the Carr College of Nursing at Harding University

Purpose: The purpose of this well child clinic is to provide a screening process children enjoy while obtaining the necessary health information for entry into preschool and kindergarten programs. Nursing students, supervised by nursing professors at all times, use playful techniques throughout the screening. Our goal is for your child to have fun and to experience this screening as “play” rather than an “examination”.

For Whom: *Children ages 2-10 years old.* If your child is shy or afraid of health care providers, our clinic environment is ideal. We offer a screening to meet the unique needs of your child.

What is Offered: A complete check-up including all body systems, vision and hearing screenings, as well as a routine urine test are offered.

Dates: The following Tuesdays and Thursdays: *February 15th and 22nd; March 13th, 15th, 22nd and 29th; April 3rd and 5th.* *Appointment times begin between 9:30 am and 3:00 pm.* Allow 1.5 hours for your appointment.

For an Appointment Time: Appointments are offered on a first come basis. *Call the Carr College of Nursing at 501-279-4475 for an appointment.*

Place: The nursing clinic is on the left of main entrance in the Swaid Center for Health Sciences (building #15) on the Harding University Campus in Searcy. Park in the slots marked “visitor” near the covered drop off entrance. See map on back.
