Frida Kahlo at the New York Botanical Garden

On October 29, 2015, a select few of our freshmen class had the opportunity to attend the Frida Kahlo exhibit at the New York Botanical Garden. While there, we were also allowed to see the many other exhibits available at the Botanical Garden, one of which was the Haupt Conservatory. The conservatory had a lovely Victorian-style glasshouse artistry to it and is a New York City landmark. The plants we saw varied from tropical water lilies to desert cacti and even a few carnivorous plants like Venus Flytraps. Inside the conservatory, there were also small Frida Kahlo setups like the well known Casa Azul, a replica of the home she shared with artist Diego Rivera. It was absolutely amazing to see the work of such a popular artist in person. The exhibit focused on Kahlo's lesser known still life work that highlighted the use of botanical imagery such as Self-Portrait with a Thorn Necklace, Hummingbird, and Flower of Life. Another part of the exhibit held a replica of The Two Fridas configured by the Botanical's resident artist Humberto Spíndola.





We ended our lovely trip with lunch where we had a variety of options. Many selected Casa Azul Tacos, the eating choice that was at the Frida Kahlo exhibit. After lunch, we were given time to go into the gift shop and buy souvenirs many of which went along with the Frida Kahlo exhibit.

The trip was an amazing experience and was far better than I think any of the students attending could have imagined.

ENL Thanksgiving




Kurt Cobain "Montage of Heck The Home Recordings"
