Dear Community Members,

challenge that our schools have ever faced. NIPPERSINK SD 2 BOARD OF EDUCATION DEVELOPS LONG-TERM FACILITY PLANS

Beginning in 2018, Nippersink SD 2 hired Wold Architects and Engineers to develop longterm facility plans to address needed repairs and renovations to the District's schools. Top priorities that were identified through this process were the removal of aging classroom mobiles at each grade school and the need for renovations to the 73-year-old Nippersink Middle School (NMS).

During the last five years, the District has been replacing windows, doors and renovating restrooms at NMS. However, the middle school is in significant need of internal maintenance due to the age and lifespan of most of its mechanicals. These maintenance issues at NMS are scheduled to be addressed during the next step of the long-term facility plan which includes replacement of all piping, boilers, HVAC, roofs and electrical wiring. The long-term facilities plan also includes the renovation of the front office at NMS.

The cost of building a new middle school was explored, but it proved to be significantly more expensive than the total cost for the renovation plans at all three schools. Therefore, the architects and engineers, in consultation with the Nippersink SD 2 Board of Education, have developed a plan to significantly improve our current facilities at a much lower price than it would cost to build a new middle school.

Under this plan, the renovation of NMS would coincide with the removal of the mobile classrooms at both grade schools. However, with each grade school currently near full capacity, the removal of the mobiles would require the repurposing of rooms, the addition of new classrooms and a new learning center at Spring Grove Elementary. In conjunction with these changes, significant enhancements to building security, ventilation and fire suppression systems would take place at all three District schools.

The Nippersink SD 2 Board of Education will continue to work with the architects, engineers, and, most importantly, the community in exploring project cost, potential timelines and how best to fund these needed improvements. Over the next year, the District will hold forums for community members, school staff and local businesses to discuss the proposed long-term facility plans and seek critical input and feedback.
