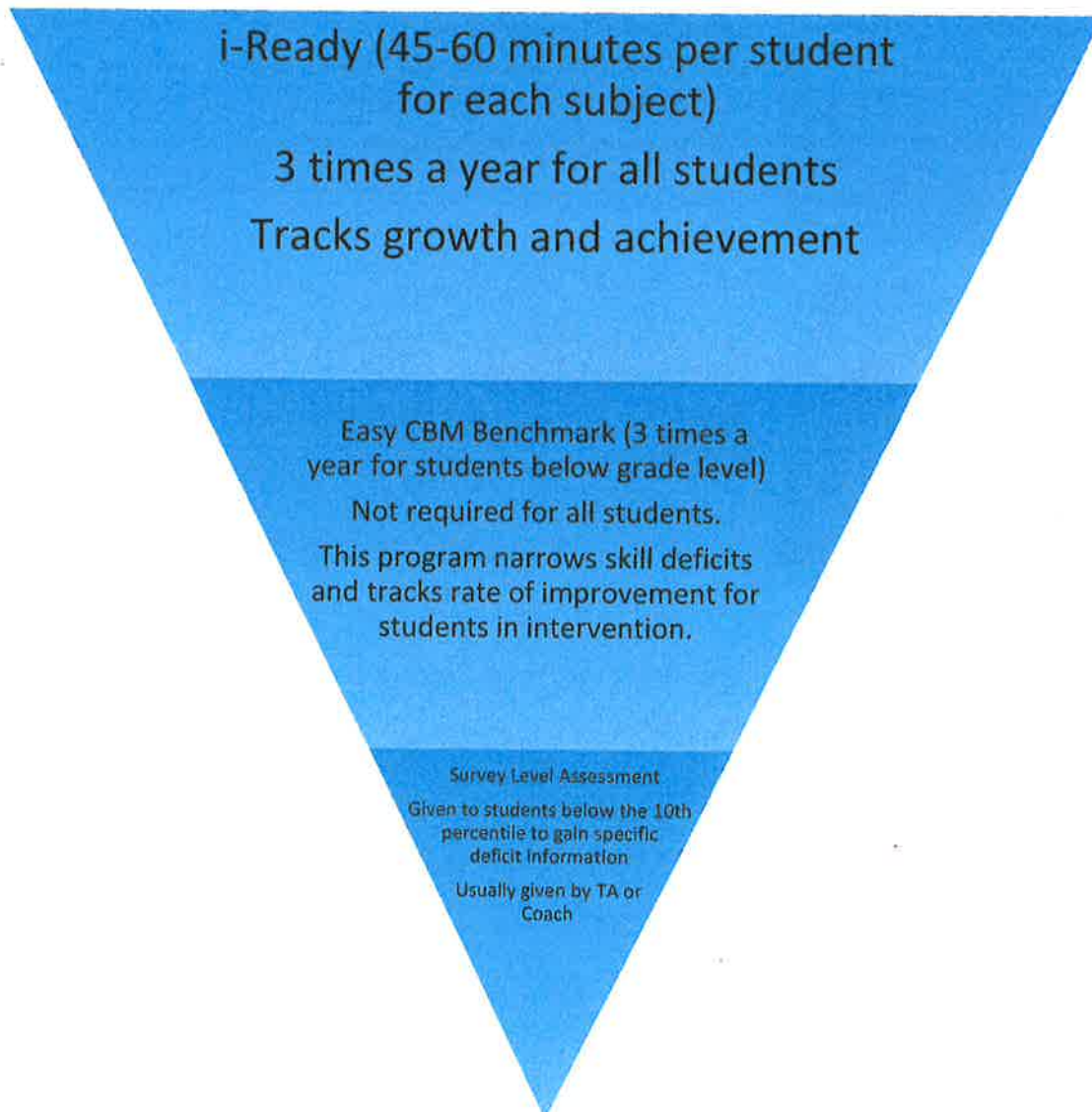

- Schools Win Coupon Books will continue to be sold until September 24. Our system-wide goal is 3,000 books and
- I have conducted a thorough review of our CCS Assessment Plan. The results are attached. This plan keeps us in compliance with the state and gives us additional needed information to ensure that our students are on track to be successful with standard expectations and TN Ready.
- We have received our District and School TVAAS scores back from our first TN Ready assessment. Districts and individual schools are given scores in ELA, Math, and Science as well as a composite score. It is with great pleasure that we announce that CCS received a composite score of 5 in student growth! This means that we had statistically significant evidence that our students made great growth. Social Studies was not included in the composite score this year because it was a field test. I am extremely proud of our teachers and students!
- ORAU awarded 14 grants to CCS teachers on Monday night. This grant opportunity provided more than \$13,000 to our district for science education. We appreciate their continued support of our system.
- The Anderson County Health Department dental screenings and Lions Club vision screenings have been completed. The results are attached. We are pleased with the level of participation in both of these services, and we appreciate the partnership with both organizations.
- CCS is hosting a Chamber of Commerce Networking Coffee on October 5 from 8:00-9:30 in the common area outside the cafeteria. We will be giving tours to any interested community member. Please come if you can and see our school in action!
