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HEALTH AND SAFETY COMMITTEE MINUTES

MEETING HELD ON February 6, 2018

The Amber-Pocasset Health and Safety Committee met on Tuesday, February 6, 2018 at 3:45 p.m. in the High School Auditorium. The agenda and meeting notice was posted on January 15, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. on the North Door of the middle hallway of Amber-Pocasset Jr. and Sr. High School in Amber, OK 73004 and at the Elementary Principal's Office Door, Pocasset, OK 73079, as well as, on the Amber-Pocasset website on the same day.

1. Steve Spears called the meeting to order at 3:45 p.m.
2. Roll Call of committee members—see sign-in sheet.
3. Steve Spears handed out copies of the Child Nutrition (aka Wellness Policy) and Physical Fitness Program Policies to be reviewed by committee members.
4. Committee discussed the specified site goals for wellness and fitness as follows:
 - A. The elementary staff had decided on September 27, 2017 to have a Family Fun Run/Walk in Pocasset to promote physical fitness and activity; to set up water/healthy snack stations, make posters with healthy eating and exercises in class that will be posted along walking course and inside building and possibly get t-shirts made and continue to do an annual Fun Run/Walk. The projected timeline is to have it the last part of April or first part of May.
 - B.&C. The Junior High Site and the High School Site will promote better awareness of health and nutrition during Mr. Spear's weekly Monday morning student body assemblies by making presentations and/or giving health tips to the student body. Also, to utilize the hallway TV to show healthy videos and add to the current curriculum in health classes.
5. The committee then reviewed the Safety Policies.
6. The committee then discussed safety issues at each site as follows:
 - A. As far as the elementary premises:
 1. All gates are locked surrounding the grounds once the buses are unloaded.
 2. After the September 27, 2017 meeting, it was decided to lock the entry door to the office and Tiffany Turner or Angie Morrison let visitors in from foyer. All other doors continue to remain locked during school hours with the only open door being the East door by the office.
 - B.&C. The Junior High and High School expressed the following concerns and suggestions:
 1. Dana James shared concern about open/unlocked doors during school hours.
 2. Suggestion made by Jennifer Ast that doors be supervised at passing periods and locked during class. This continues to be a difficult situation because classrooms are located in various buildings across the campus.
 3. Concern was discussed regarding visitors being able to enter building and having to walk halls without a checkpoint through an office. No remedy was decided upon.
 4. Tiffany Copeland would like to offer a self-defense class for senior girls and possible others.
7. Angie Morrison was elected as speaker representing Health and Safety Committee.
8. No new business.
9. Steve Spears made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Jennifer Ast. Motion carried. Meeting was adjourned at 4:42 p.m.
