Each year, the George Rodrigue Foundation of the Arts hosts a Scholarship Art & Songwriting Contest to celebrate the creativity of Louisiana's high school juniors and seniors. The Foundation awards a total of \$25,000 in college scholarships. No GPA is required to enter, and winners are not required to major in Art or Music in the future. Seniors:

Parker Alexander Attorney at Law is committed to improving safety in our community. Their 2023 scholarship program for Northeast Louisiana students will award two scholarships: a grand prize of \$2,500 and a second prize of \$500. Applicants must submit an original essay with a proposal to improve safety and/or reduce traffic accidents in Northeast Louisiana. Applications should also include a short statement as to

individual scholarship need and the student's planned course of study in college. Applications are due May 1, 2023. See Mrs. White for more details.

The Ark-La-Tex Chapter of AFCEA International awards scholarships to a number of high school seniors who plan to pursue a college education in a STEM Field: Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. These scholarships are usually \$2000. To apply, a student must have at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA and a combined 3.0 GPA for all math and science classes. See Mrs. White for more information.

If you have not completed the <u>FAFSA</u> it is time for you and your parent or guardian to do so. <u>Completion of the FAFSA is a state graduation</u> <u>requirement.</u>

Cap and gown pictures are January 24 & 25 during your English class. Please ask your English teacher which day your class will take photos. REQUIREMENTS FOR PICTURE DAY:

- BRING \$10 FOR SITTING FEE Senior Cap & Gown pictures will be taken at school for a \$10.00 sitting fee and for an additional \$10.00 Portraits Plus will take a senior outdoor picture (one outfit).
- WEAR CLOTHING SPECIFIED FOR THE PHOTO Male students should wear or bring a white button down shirt and tie for pictures and female students should wear a shirt that will not show at the neck of the gown. We suggest a v-neck shirt or a shirt that does not show close to your neck that does not have a collar.
- FACIAL PIERCINGS ARE NOT ALLOWED FOR PHOTO Since it is against our dress code to have facial piercings, they will not be allowed for cap and gown photos.

Students will come to the auditorium during their English class. Cap and gown will be provided by Portraits Plus. All pictures will be available for purchase through Portraits Plus. Each senior must turn in, to the yearbook, one picture with the cap on and one picture with the cap off. These will be used for the yearbook and the newspaper.
