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

Application Procedures:

The Office of Vital Statistics has five methods available for making a request for a birth certificate: regular mail, priority mail, telephone, internet, and walk-in customer service. Birth certificates began being filed with the Office July 1, 1911.

Application forms may be downloaded in English or Spanish from the Kansas Department of Health and Environment website www.kdheks.gov under the "People Want to Know" heading in the right hand column-Birth/Death/Marriage Certificates. Divorce certificates may also be obtained from this office.

New ID requirements: Due to the rise in identity theft and other fraudulent use of vital records, the credit card you are using to place the order must be in your name. The card holder's name and address will be verified. You will also be asked to provide your social security number or driver's license number.

Due to the rise in identity theft and other fraudulent use of vital records, acceptable ID is limited. You must provide a government (state or federal) issued photo ID. This can be issued by the U.S. or other country of residence.

Examples of acceptable IDs (must be current):

Photocopy of driver's license Photocopy of state ID card Photocopy of passport or visa Photocopy of military ID

If you do not have a government issued photo ID, you must send photocopies of any TWO of the following:

Social security number

Bank statement with current address

	Your child under age 1 should always ride in a rear-facing car seat in the back seat. There are different types of rear-facing care seats. Infant-only seats can only be used rear0facing. Convertible and 3-in-1 eats typically have higher height and weight limits for the rear-facing position, allowing you to keep your child rear-facing for a longer period of time.
REAR-FACING CAR SEAT	A rear-facing car seat is the best seat for your young child to use. It has a harness and in a crash, cradles and moves with your child to reduce the stress to the child's fragile neck and spinal cord.
- ¥-	Keep your child rear-facing as long as possible. It's the best way to keep him or her safe. Your child should remain in a rear-facing car seat until he or she reaches the top height or weigh limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. Once your child outgrows the rear-facing car seat, your child is ready to trave! in a forward-facing car seat with a harness in the back seat.
FORWARD-FACING CAR SEAT	A forward-facing car seat has a harness and tether that limits your child's forward movement during a crash.
	Keep your child in a forward-facing car seat with a harness until he or she reaches the top height or weight limit allowed by your car seat's manufacturer. Once your child outgrows the forward- facing car seat with a harness, it's time to travel in a booster seat, but still in the back seat.
	A booster seat positions the seat belt so that it fits properly over the stronger parts of your child's body.
BOOSTER SEAT	Kansas law requires use of a car seat or booster seat until your child is at least 8 years old OR 4'9" tall OR weighs 80 pounds.
	Keep your child in a booster seat until he or she is big enough to fit in a seat belt properly. For a seat belt to fit properly, the lap belt must lie snugly across the upper thighs, not the stomach. The shoulder belt should lie snug across the shoulder and chest and not cross the neck or face.
SEAT BELT	Remember, your child should still ride in the back seat until age 13 because it's safer for children to ride as far away from the airbags possible.

Circles of Hope engages our community to equip families to permanently leave poverty through empowering relationships that build resources and address community-wide barriers. Their mission is to end poverty through empowering circles of relationship and to work together as a community to remove barriers that keep people trapped in poverty.

Participants (called circle leaders) go through a life skills class that includes goal setting. They then join their circle for 18 to 24 months. Each circle leader is matched with a couple of "allies" who offer friendship and advice, and help connect them to community resources.

Kansas Cold Weather Rule

Effective November 1 – March 31

The Cold Weather Rule in most cases prevents or limits utility companies from disconnecting a customer's natural gas or electric service during periods of extreme cold. The Rule requires utility companies to offer a 12 month payment plan to allow consumers to maintain or re-establish utility service.

Disconnection Conditions:

Utility companies may not initiate disconnection until temperatures are forecast to be above 35 degrees for the next 48 hours.

Utility companies must attempt to contact the customer by phone or in-person 24 hours before disconnecting service.

Utility companies are prohibited from disconnecting a customer's service when temperatures are forecast to be at or below 35 degrees over the next 24 hours.

Payment Plan conditions to maintain or restore service:

Customers must contact their utility company and inform that they cannot pay their bill in full. Customers must agree to pay 1/12th of the total amount owed, 1/12th of the current bill, the full amount of any disconnection or reconnection fee, plus any applicable deposit to the utility. Customers must agree to pay the remaining balance in equal payments over the next 11 months, in addition to their current monthly bill.

*The Cold Weather Rule applies only to residential customers of electric and natural gas utility companies under the Kansas Corporation Commission's jurisdiction.

Safe Haven Infant Protection Laws enable a person to give up an unwanted infant (up to 45 days old) anonymously. As long as the baby has not been abused, the person may do so without fear of arrest or prosecution. The purpose of Safe Haven is to protect unwanted babies from being hurt or killed because they were abandoned. It's safe. It's anonymous. You do not need to tell anyone.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF SAFE HAVEN PROVIDERS:

Take custody of child, perform any act necessary to protect health and safety of the child and notify local law enforcement.

PROTECTION FOR RELINQUISHING PARENT:

Person leaving a baby with a Safe Haven will not be prosecuted for abandonment if the baby has suffered no harm.

EFFECT ON PARENTAL RIGHTS:

Petition will be filed for termination of parental rights and an expedition hearing will be held on the petition.

The Safe Haven Law provides a safe choice instead of abandoning or putting your baby in danger. A distressed parent who is unable or unwilling to care for their infant can give up custody of their baby, no questions asked. They must simply bring the infant to a safe haven location and make sure they locate a person to give the child. As long as the child shows no signs of intentional abuse, no name or other information is required.

You can leave your baby, up to 45 days old, with an employee at any medical facility, fire department, city or county health department in Kansas.

Can only a parent bring in the baby?

No. The parent may choose to have someone else bring in the infant. It can be a family member, a friend, a priest or minister, a social worker—practically any responsible adult.

Who may relinquish?

Parent or person having legal custody.
