- 1. Speak of their "brave" as they are already there.
- 2. Give permission for imperfection and encourage their sense of adventure.
- 3. You won't always feel ready, that's why it's brave.

Another topic that I have enjoyed teaching about this year is the brain! Specifically the "upstairs" and "downstairs" brain. It is important for everyone to know how the brain works so that we can understand what is happening when we experience big emotions such as sadness, anger or even a case of the sillies! My goal is to teach kids strategies that they can use to get back to their "upstairs brain" and be learning ready! Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek & Slide

Ah, the sounds of summer! May is skin cancer awareness month, so here are some tips to keep your skin healthy this summer as you play in the sun:

<u>Slip</u> on protective clothing. Keep exposed skin covered as much as possible. Use loose fitting clothes made of tightly woven material.

<u>Slop</u> on the sunscreen. Use broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher. Apply a generous amount to exposed skin 20 minutes before sun exposure and reapply every 2 hours or as often as recommended on the label.

<u>Slap</u> on a hat with a wide brim to protect eyes, ears, face, and back or neck. These are areas prone to over exposure to the sun.

Seek shade.

<u>Slide</u> on a pair of sunglasses that provide 99-100% UVA & UVB protection.
