It is the goal of Waverly City Schools to return to full in-person learning for all students in grades preschool-twelve following the 2021-22 school calendar. All plans are subject to change at the Superintendent's discretion based on the recommendations from the Ohio Department of Education guidelines, the State of Ohio guidelines, the Pike County Health District, and community and district COVID-19 cases.

Outline of Plan		
Health and Hygiene	-Students and staff are encouraged to do daily home COVID-19 screening and stay home if sick or have symptoms. -The school district will follow all current CDC, Ohio Department of Health and Pike County Health District guidance for mask requirements for students and staff. -All efforts will be made to practice social distancing. The school district will follow all current CDC, Ohio Department of Health and Pike County Health District guidance for distancing. -Mobile hand sanitizing stations will be placed throughout the buildings. -Frequent hand washing and hand sanitizing will be scheduled. -Students will be instructed in proper hygiene.

Cleaning & Sanitation of Facilities	-Common areas (offices, classrooms, hallways, bathrooms, buses) will continue to be sanitized and cleaned more oftenCustodial staff will enhance their cleaning of touchpoints during the school day and after school hoursReplacing high traffic carpet areas is currently being addressed -Ventilation and fresh air flow will continue to be monitored and regulated in accordance to CDC guidelines.
Contact Tracing, isolation & Quarantine Procedures	-The district will work with the Pike County Health District to follow all guidelines for quarantines, contract tracing, isolation and other related procedures. -The Superintendent and school nurse will continue to work with the Pike County Health District to determine quarantine and isolation lengths based on CDC guidance. -Symptomatic staff and students will be advised to follow the Covid-19 flow chart to determine if COVID testing is needed before returning to the school environment.
Vaccination Efforts	-During the 2020-2021 school year, all staff of the district who chose to receive the COVID vaccine were given the opportunity to do so. -The school district will continue to partner with the Pike County Health District to provide opportunities for staff and student vaccinations as they become available and as their families choose to receive them.
Addressing Student Academic Needs	-The district will offer a Summer Learning Opportunity for students in K-8 in June and August and will have credit recovery opportunities for 9-12 during the summerAdditional instructional personnel for intensive instruction K-2 during the school day will be providedExtra tutoring during the school day for students in K-12 will be provided for those students in needStudents with disabilities will receive accommodations as they are determined by the IEP team of the particular child. Exemption from state and local health orders and CDC guidelines will be used, as needed, to meet the needs of identified students.
Addressing Student Social, Emotional and Mental Needs	-Counselors and principals will continue to work with all staff to identify students in needCOPE Coordinator and Director will continue to support families in needWaverly City Schools will continue partnership with local agencies (Integrated Services, Scioto Paint Valley, Adena, Community Action, etc.).

<u>Technology</u>	-Students will be provided 1:1 devices and teachers will utilize Google Classroom to ensure that learning can continue remotely during the 2021-22 school year if necessaryHotspots are available if needed.
Food Service Plan for Remote Learning	-If school is forced to close due to the pandemic, plans are already established for the continuity of food service for students. During times of full closures during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 school years a plan was established to provide meal delivery to students who request meals and can be re-established immediately if needed. -The school district also partners with local organizations such as the Power Pack program, Community Action and Pike County Outreach to provide meals for families throughout the school year.
