## Beavercreeek Board of Education Meeting - June 21, 2018

## I. CALL TO ORDER

The Beavercreek Board of Education met in regular session on Thursday, June 21, 2018 at the Board of Education/Administration building. Board President, Ms. Rigano, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. welcoming everyone.
II. ROLL CALL

A quorum was declared with four members present.

## III. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Ms. Rigano invited everyone to join in the saying of the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

## IV. PRESENTATIONS

## A. Academic Team Recognition - Team Captain, Hari Parameswaran

Julie Cohen was invited to the podium by Superintendent Paul Otten. Ms. Cohen spoke of Ms. Ellen Spence who has been the head coach of the academic team for the past three years. Ms. Cohen spoke of the team that consisted of David Cohen-2018 BHS Graduate, Abby Cohen-BHS Sophomore, Hari Parameswaran-BHS Senior and team captain, and Ziyi Zuo-2018 BHS Graduate. This year the team came in first in state in the Ohio Academic Competition, the team came in fifth in a the national competition Academic Quiz Bowl tournament, and in the national competition for the Partnership for Academic Excellence the team came in eighth. While competing in the National History Bee David Cohen came in twenty-forth in the nation for U.S. History, while Hari Parameswaran came in twenty-sixth but first in Ohio for overall history, while David Cohen came in second for overall history. The team also competed in the national History Bowl and came in seventh in the nation. Named the all world player of the year for BAQT was Hari Parameswaran. He will also be competing in the Berlin All World First Team. Last weekend he competed at the National All Star Academic tournament and his team came in third place nationally.

Mr. Hari Parameswaran took the podium and thanked the board for the opportunity to speak of the achievements of the past two years for the Academic Team. Mr. Parameswaran went on to explain the competitions in more detail. He explained the Jeopardy type of setting in which questions covering, but not limited to, literature, physics, math, science, and history. The competitors were asked detailed questions and buzzers were used to determine who was first to answer. Unlike Jeopardy, the quiz team setting focuses less on trivia type questions and concentrates more on academic material like one would learn in a classroom environment. He gave an example of the question structure on Jeopardy versus an academic question structure. He let everyone know that during competition a competitor does not have to wait until the end of the question to give the answer. Once a correct answer is given, the team gets an opportunity to get more points.

Mr. Parameswaran spoke of the achievements made by the team this year and shared that this year the Beavercreek Academic Team performed one of the biggest feats in the history of any Ohio Academic Team. At the two major national competitions hosted by the National Academic Quiz Tournaments and the Partnerships for Academic Competition Excellence the team place fifth and eighth respectively. He explained how with hard work and practice the teams won the GWOC and the state competition with just two years of experience. In the third year of competing the team lived up to those rankings and began winning so many tournaments, the trophy case cannot hold them all. He then shared the details of the History Bowl and the team accomplishments in these competitions.

Mr. Parameswaran thanked Ellen Spence for coaching the team for the past three years, and for her encouragement and support. He stated that without her support the team definitely would not be where they are today. He also thanked all of his teammates who stuck with him throughout. He stated that everyone put in hard work to ensure that the teams made top ten at the tournaments attended this year. Mr. Parameswaran spoke of the tough losses during the season and his pride at everyone sticking together through these losses. He also thanked the parents who have supported this team. He gave thanks for the parents of the students for both their support of the students trough attendance and organizing, in addition to their financial support through fundraising amongst local businesses. Thanks to Ms. Spence Walmart gives a donation each year, in addition to support from Day Air Credit Union and Fresh Thyme. He gave a special "thank you" to Ms. Angela the manager at Fresh Thyme for keeping the team fed at different competitions. Mr. Parameswaran thanked Ms. Cohen for covering for Ms. Spence while she would out on maternity leave this year.

The Board members were invited to participate in a round against the students led by Ms. Cohen. The round started with a buzzer check and once started the round proceeded on to questions and answers. The round went to the students. The final score was 5 to 0.

In Closing, Mr. Parameswaran spoke of the hope for continued and ongoing support by the school district and community.

The board gave the students each a Certificate of Appreciation for all that they have accomplished, and had the students gather with the members of the Board of Education for a picture.
B. Jet Recognition - Mr. Paul Otten

Superintendent Otten recognized individuals who were instrumental in bringing the Jet here to Beavercreek City Schools. Mr. Otten spoke of the opportunity upon joining Beavercreek City Schools two years ago of going to the airport to see the jet and seeing the vision set forth for the Jet Project. He shared to positive outcomes for accepting the Jet, such as the awareness at a state level. The cost to the district while housed was at Dayton International Airport was zero, but it did bring forth a grant of nine hundred eighty four thousand dollars to Greene County. After much review and debate it was determined the cost to utilize the jet would not be feasible without expense that would be a cost of tax dollars and since it was determined early on that tax dollars would not be used an alternative needed decided for the Jet. After meeting with the Ohio Department of Education, granted was permission to modify the grant to allow, along with the other six districts in Greene County to bring STEM education Mr. Otten shared that the Jet ownership given to the City of Dayton who is giving the Jet to Sinclair Community College. Sinclair will be utilizing the Jet as part of their Aerospace Program.

Mr. Otten wanted to recognize those individuals instrumental in bringing the Jet to Beavercreek City Schools and thank them. He also wanted to them to understand the impact that they are having on the kids in Greene County.

Board President, Jo Ann Rigano spoke of the timelines and many contributions of the individuals involved. So to honor and recognize those involved, the following individuals gifted to show the district's appreciation; Debbie Alberico, Natalie Johnson of Clark State, along with Ross McNutt whose wife accepted the gift in his stead and Pete Petrini with gifts of appreciation.

The Board Members, The Superintendent, along with the Treasurer stood with the aforementioned individuals for a picture.

Mr. Otten, spoke in honor of Ms. Little and of her value to Beavercreek City Schools.
Ms. Connie Little, Director of Food Services was recognized by Deron Schwieterman for her 23 years of service.
Ms. Little will receive a plaque for appreciation of services to Beavercreek City Schools, a copy of the board resolution, and an athletic/event pass.

Her direct supervisor, Mr. Greg Thompson presented Ms. Little with flowers and spoke of her family, career and how grateful to have worked with her here at Beavercreek City Schools. Ms. Little received a standing ovation.

Ms. Little spoke briefly of her family, staff, and thanked the board members.

## A. Naming of District Facility

Mr. Otten spoke of interest of a group in naming a district facility after an individual. This discussion was occurring to see if there was interest by the board in seeing this come to fruition. Mr. Otten told the board members that they have the authority to take that action if so agreed upon by vote. He shared that there are two areas of criteria to be met according to board policy. 1. The Board will consider naming school property for an individual(s) who has demonstrated exceptional support to the district, exhibited strong moral character and when the total donation on behalf of the said individual(s) is $5 \%$ or more of the total cost of the property. All such donations must have prior approval of the Board, meet all local, state, and federal guidelines, and contribute to the growth and benefit of the district. All donated property accepted by the Board becomes the property of Beavercreek City Schools and will be governed by Board policy.
2. The Board may also name property for an individual if the individual had made outstanding contributions to the district, community, county, state, or nation. The character of the individual must be unquestioned (as determined by the Board).

As we proceed throughout the year, we will see if our projections hold and we will update our forecast accordingly.

Executive Summary-Financial Reporting For the Month of May 2018 Local Receipts
$\checkmark$ Real Estate Taxes collected fiscal year-to-date total $\$ 58,858,858$ which is in alignment with fiscal year projected receipts. $\qquad$
$\checkmark$ Our current tax base is stable and growing slowly. This is showing slight recovery from the recessionary impacts in the last few years. $\qquad$
$\checkmark$ We are anticipating to ask for new levy money in probably 2018 for collection in 2019 per our five year forecast...stay tuned. It does depend largely on how the state funds our district in the next couple of years on how $\qquad$ well we are able to "make ends meet" with what we have already in place.

## Revenues:

$\checkmark$ Our non-operating receipts are comprised of $\$ 2,037,295$. $\$ 1,511,280$ of general funds were advanced to Straight A grants in deficit at end of the Fiscal Year 2017 and $\$ 518,783$ were for the other grants. Typically, the grants are awaiting federal/state reimbursements at year-end. It was a bit unusual this year to have such a large deficit in the straight A grant fund, but the activity for the spending of those funds were done only in June which created a large deficit all at once and was not predictable in our projections.
$\checkmark$ This practice of advancing funds to/from the general fund at year-end/yearbeginning is in compliance with Ohio Revised Code and is audited annually to be sure proper accounting is used.
$\checkmark$ We are in compliance.

Expenditures:
$\checkmark$ Salaries and wages as of May are coming in under projections by approximately $\$-643,284$.
$\checkmark$ Fringe benefits as of the month of May came in under projections by approximately $\$-385,450$. $\qquad$
$\checkmark$ These expenditures will ebb and flow from month-to-month as we monitor them to be sure they are in compliance with the five year forecast. $\qquad$

## Expenditures:

$\checkmark$ As of May, we are in alignment with budgeted expenditures, $91.67 \%$ of the fiscal year has elapsed and we have spent $85.51 \%$ of the annual budget. Our cash-flow is positive and we expect to end the year within budget.
$\checkmark$ We did have $\$ 2,037,295$ in advances to close the books as of June 30, 2017 We made these advances from General Fund to the various grant funds awaiting reimbursement from state and federal sources. Since the grants are reimbursing, we must advance funds at year-end so they are not in a deficit. Advances are not required to be budgeted per Ohio Law.

WHEREAS, the County Auditor of Greene County, Ohio has certified to the Board that an estimated annual levy of 6.2 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which is $\$ 0.62$ for each one hundred dollars of valuation, will be required to produce the annual amount set forth in the Resolution of Necessity.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Beavercreek City School District, Greene and Montgomery Counties, Ohio, a majority of the members of the Board concurring, that:

Section 1. The Board desires to proceed with the submission of the question of such additional emergency tax levy (the "Emergency Levy") to the electors of the School District.

Section 2. The question of the Emergency Levy shall be submitted to the electors in the entire territory of the School District at the election to be held on November 6, 2018 (the "Election Date"). All of the territory of the School District is in Greene and Montgomery Counties, Ohio.


Section 3. The form of the ballot to be used at said election shall be substantially as follows:
Shall a levy be imposed by the Beavercreek City School District, Greene and Montgomery Counties, Ohio for the purpose of providing for the emergency requirements of the School District in the sum of $\$ 11,408,995$ and a levy of taxes to be made outside of the ten-mill limitation estimated by the county auditor to average 6.2 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to $\$ 0.62$ cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a period of five years, commencing in 2018, first due in calendar year $2019 ?$

The Treasurer of the Board is hereby directed and shall certify, not later than August 8, 2018 (which date is not less than 90 days prior to the Election Date), to the Board of Elections of Greene County, Ohio a copy of the Resolution of Necessity and a copy of this resolution, together with the amount of the annual tax levy expressed in dollars and cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, as well as in mills for each one dollar of valuation, as estimated by the County Auditor of Greene County, Ohio.

Section 5. The Treasurer of the Board is hereby directed and shall certify to the Board of Elections of Greene County, Ohio that the Emergency Levy will run for a period of five years and that the Emergency Levy will include a levy on the 2018 tax list and duplicate (2019 collection year) if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.

Typically, the grants are awaiting federal/state reimbursements at year-end. It was a bit unusual this year to have such a large deficit in the Straight A grant fund, but the activity for the spending of those funds were done only in July which created a large deficit all at once and was not predictable in our projections.
$\checkmark$ This practice of advancing funds to/from the general fund at year-end/yearbeginning is in compliance with Ohio Revised Code and is audited annually to be sure proper accounting is used.

3. The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance personnel and administration
4. Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation
5. Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules
6. Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available; and

WHEREAS the option of offering payment-in-lieu of transportation is provided in Ohio Revised Code: Therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Beavercreek City Schools Board of Education hereby approves the declaration that it is impractical to transport the students identified herein and offers the parent(s)/guardian(s) of students named on the attachment, payment-in-lieu of transportation.
