Hey Parents!

Do you have a child entering **kindergarten, 7th grade or 12th grade** this fall? If so, they may need some shots before the 2020-2021 school year begins.

According to the Ohio Department of Health rules for the 2020-2021 school year, incoming 7th graders are required to have one dose of both a Tdap and Meningitis (MCV4) vaccine and 12th graders are required to have one or two doses of the Meningitis (MCV4) vaccine.

Tdap vaccine protects against three diseases: Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis. The MCV4 vaccine protects against four strains of Meningitis (A, C, W, Y).

The health dept. is maintaining social distancing guidelines during all clinics. Because of this they are having more clinics throughout the summer. In order to do this safely, they ask that you:

- *Wear a mask when entering the health department.
- *Leave other children at home if possible.

Appointments are required. NO WALK-INS will be allowed.

Please consider scheduling an appointment early because they cannot allow more people in the building than distancing rules can safely support. **August is typically very congested with full clinics, so please do not delay this year. Please call 419-523-5608 for an appointment.**



Guidance from the state level about opening and restarting sports activities and facilities for the high school student athletes will soon allow coaches to complete their plans for summer. They will be contacting their athletes directly as schedules are finalized.

Information will be posted to the JH/HS Sports Calendar on our website as updates are received.



LUNCH PROGRAM

All children ages 1 through 18 (no adults) are eligible to receive free meals during the summer months at participating program sites. Individuals ages 19 through 21 who have been identified as having mental or physical disabilities and are following Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) through their current enrollment in educational programs also are eligible for free summer meals.
