Annual Report – Fall 2018

The State of Continental Local Schools is EXCELLENT.

Welcome to the 2018-2019 school year. I am so excited for what this year has to offer us. Going into my third year as superintendent, I would like to highlight some of the wonderful programs and opportunities to support our kids through the school, community, and county. We have: Packs for Pirates, Christmas for Kids, Relay for Life, POP - Parents of Pirates, Blue and Gold Club, Music Boosters, Lions Club and the United Way We also have Pathways of Putnam County (with support from ADAMHS Board of Putnam County), the Putnam County Educational Service Center, and our very own K-6 and 7-12 counselors to assist our students and families in supporting their social/emotional needs. Together, the Continental Local Schools, Continental Community, and Putnam County are working hard for you and your children. There is an old saying that it takes a village to raise a child. I am very proud of the countywide village we have in place to support ALL of us. If you are in need of support or help, please do not hesitate to communicate with the school. We will help point you in the right direction for the assistance you need.

Our school district has also been hard at work updating our technology, curriculum, and other school programs. Please continue to read about the wonderful things happening at Continental Local Schools.

Technology

What have we been doing in the world of technology? Continental Local Schools feel it is important to prepare our students for the future. To enhance the excellent education clearly provided to our students, Continental has introduced many new tools to the classroom. On the machine side, we updated our iPads for all teachers and students in grades 9-12. We not only provided new iPads to each student, but keyboards to enhance productivity. In grades K-8, we have added Chromebooks. We utilize Google App for Education (called G Suite) and are able to create, revise, and share our work with others to promote collaboration among students, teachers, and parents. Since 2016, we have updated iPads, added over 200 Chromebooks, and put new computers on teachers' desks. We have also added two 3D printers, plotter printers, and updated our infrastructure to support this technology and the technology of tomorrow.

Along with updating and providing technology for each and every student and teacher in the district, we are also in the process of updating other teacher tools like interactive boards to help teachers improve delivery of lessons.

Although there is a lot of information about technology, it means very little without software programs to enhance learning. We are now better able to provide online textbooks and supplemental materials like Measuring Up Live, MobyMax, Accelerated Reader, Google Classroom, and Schoology just to name a few.

You can see, we are moving in the right direction in providing twenty-first century tools to our students and teachers but technology cannot and will not replace a teacher. All this technology is quite useless without a dedicated, hard-working teacher to bring the education to life for our students.

Buildings and Grounds

As you may have noticed over the past two summers, there has been a lot of work going on at Continental Local Schools. We have been busy updating and maintaining the exterior of our building, providing improvements to our parking lots and driveways, and fixing our drainage systems as well as providing needs maintenance to our playing fields. The summer/fall of 2016 we installed a new digital sign in front of the high school and put up new scoreboards for baseball, softball, and soccer.

We also updated our fire safety suppression system at both buildings, and updated our heating and cooling system in the elementary school as well as put LED lighting in the entire elementary school. The upgrades to lighting alone, throughout the entire district, has saved approximately \$10,000 per year. With grants from AEP, these upgrades paid for themselves in two years.

During the summer/fall of 2018, we have continued to work at saving money and improving our school district. After some very hard rainfall the year before, we had extreme flooding in our high school. We updated drainage behind the school, fixed an issue along the north side of the high school, and refaced the elementary to make sure water goes where we want it to and not into our buildings.

These and many other maintenance related issues continue to be addressed both to save the district money, improve the environment of the buildings, and help maintain our aging buildings. The last major upgrades are 19 years old and parts of the buildings are from 50 to 90 years old. Our maintenance staff does a great job keeping the building clean, safe and educationally ready for our students. Please take time to thank them for their hard work.

9/11 Memorial Stair Climb

On September 9th, students, staff members and their families, and local first responders held a stair climb event at the high school building to honor the 412 emergency workers that lost their lives on September 11th.
