Once a month, *Solid Waste Management* sends a truck to our school to pick up our school's recyclables. Students go around to various locations in the high school and elementary building once a week to collect recyclables. They bring them back to Mrs. Siefker's classroom (Family and Consumer Science teacher) where they are sorted into paper, cardboard, and plastic. So far this year, Continental has recycled 2630 pounds (1.315 tons) of paper and cardboard products. This is a great amount but are we missing opportunities to do even more? Leipsic and St. Mary's Schools have recycled 6260 pounds

(3.13 tons); Miller City School 1660 pounds (.83 tons); and Columbus Grove School 2260 pounds (1.13 tons).

Paper products that are accepted include paper, magazines, books, file folders, poster boards, catalogs, phone books, newspapers, cardboard, junk mail, envelopes without plastic windows or metal tabs. We also collect cardboard which the students flatten down and remove tape and staples from.

The three R's in waste management are REDUCE, REUSE, and RECYCLE. Reducing waste saves landfill space. Reusing materials creates less trash. Recycling allows materials to be remade into new useful products. More recycling information is available at <u>www.putnamcountyrecycles.com</u>

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SOPHOMORES TO VISIT VANTAGE CAREER CENTER



NATIONAL SCHOOL BREAKFAST WEEK MARCH 5-9, 2018

March 5-9 is *National School Breakfast Week*. Breakfasts are available to all students and served daily from 8:00-8:30 a.m. Prices are \$1.75 for a fully paid breakfast. Students who qualify for reduced meals are offered a breakfast for \$.30 and those qualifying for free meals may receive free breakfast. Currently, we serve approximately 70 breakfasts daily at Continental School.

Breakfast consists of milk, fruit or fruit juice, and two bread offerings. Twice weekly, a hot item is offered.



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Preschool Registration

Early Discovery Preschool pre-registration for next school year, 2018-2019, begins **February 1, 2018**.

<u>Children currently enrolled</u> and not yet 5 years of age by May 31 will be receiving an application from their teacher to complete and return.

<u>New children</u>: Younger siblings, family members, or friends who have a child 3 or 4 years of age may call the Putnam County Educational Service Center, 419-523-5951, for enrollment information. Children who are 4 years of age and children with disabilities will be given priority. Reduced rates may be available to those who qualify.
