Welcome to the 2017-2018 school year. Continental Local Schools had a great 2016-2017 and we are looking forward to even more excitement to come. As you read through this newsletter today, you will meet the new staff, learn about bussing, new information from the cafeteria and have the opportunity to hear about our Spanish Club's trip to Costa Rica.

What's new for 2017-2018. Continental has created and developed a Kinderstart Program to help students just starting out in school become the best they can be. If you want to know more about this program, please contact the elementary. We have also brought back gifted services for 1 day per week at the elementary and are discussing how to better serve our gifted students in the high school.

In the technology world, we have upgraded our network, updated our one to one program for the high school and provided every middle school student with access to a chromebook. At the elementary we now have 195 chromebooks. We were also able to update the technology in the hands of our teachers so they can keep pace with our students.

During this school year, we will be putting a major focus on updating our curriculum. This is an effort to provide the most up to date resources for teachers and students. The Spanish department has already received their new curriculum and will be accessing it through their iPads. This is also happening in sign language and has been happening for a couple of years in freshman social studies.

Bussing

One bus change to note...Bus #2 will be making the trailer court stop this year, both in the AMs and PMs.



Parents are asked to have their children ready for bus pick ups at least ten_minutes early during the first several days of school, as bus schedules are being worked out. Parents wanting their children picked up or dropped off at a location other than their residence will need to complete a transportation form, available at the school offices. Families will not be able to alter pick up/drop-off locations on a daily or weekly basis as this is not permitted.



2017-2018 Cafeteria Prices



Due to the required guidelines of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), some of our cafeteria prices have increased for the 2017-2018 school year. Prices are as follows:

Optional Breakfast, Grades K-12	\$1.75
Grades K-6 Lunch	\$2.40
Grades 7-12 Lunch	\$2.90
Reduced Price Meals, Grades K-12	\$.40
Reduced Price Breakfast, Grades K-12	\$.30
Ala Carte Plate Lunch	\$3.25

Free and Reduced Lunch Applications will be sent home with students at Open House and on the first day of school. Forms may also be picked up in the school offices. If you have been notified that you were approved through direct certification, you do not need to complete this application.

Parents are asked to send cafeteria money in an envelope with your children's names, and cafeteria lunch numbers. You may send one check for multiple children as long as you note the amounts going to each child.

If you want to use the online payment option, you will need to use your child's student ID#. *This is not the same number as their cafeteria number*. Your child's student ID# (the number assigned to them in ProgressBook) is the number that you will use for online cafeteria payments. If you do not know this number, please contact the office or cafeteria manager and they will be glad to give it to you.

In an effort to keep lunch accounts up to date, we are implementing a new plan. Students who have a negative balance of \$5.00 will not be permitted to purchase "extras". Students having a negative balance of \$10.00 will not be allowed additional charges and will instead receive a "sack lunch". All lunch accounts can be accessed online, where parents can monitor their child's purchases and balances.

We are fortunate to have a great cafeteria staff who prepare daily meals for your children that meet the requirements set by the USDA.
