Screening Checklist for Parents Before Sending Kids to School (Many of these symptoms exist with other conditions, but loss of taste/smell is unique to COVID19):

High Risk Symptoms Include: Loss of Taste or Smell, Blue Toes, A New Cough, Difficulty Breathing

Moderate Risk Symptoms Include: Oral Temp of 100.4+, Sore Throat, New Uncontrolled Cough or a Change in a Chronic Cough (from asthma, etc) from Baseline; Diarrhea, Vomiting or Abdominal Pain; Congestion/Runny Nose; Muscle or Body Aches.
