Policies on mitigation strategies:

Universal and correct wearing of masks

Trumbull Career and Technical Center (TCTC) will follow all Ohio Department of Health and Trumbull County Combined Health District guidelines in regards to facial coverings. Staff and students who are not vaccinated will be encouraged to continue wearing masks for the 2021-2022 school year. If deemed necessary for all to wear masks, signage will be posted indicating this, and the school nurse will review correct wearing of masks with staff and students.

Physical distancing (e.g., including use of cohorts/podding)

TCTC will follow all Ohio Department of Health and Trumbull County Combined Health District guidelines in regards to physical distancing. Social distancing will be encouraged where possible.

Handwashing and respiratory etiquette

TCTC will continue to promote routine handwashing and hand sanitizing. Sanitizer stations will be placed throughout the building and at all entrances to cafeteria food lines. PPE/masks/supplies will be available. Signage promoting and detailing proper hand washing/sanitizing will remain posted throughout the building.

Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation

Custodial staff are trained on proper disinfecting protocols. High-touch areas (handrails, door handles, desks, tables, etc.) will be sanitized throughout the day using products approved for COVID-19 disinfecting. Electrostatic sprayers will continue to be used in classrooms.
Regular inspections of HVAC equipment will continue to ensure it is operating correctly, including routine maintenance and filter changes.

Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the state, local, territorial or tribal health departments

TCTC will follow all Ohio Department of Health and Trumbull County Combined Health District guidelines in regards to contact tracing, isolation, and quarantine. The school nurse will continue to serve as COVID-19 coordinator to communicate cases to the health department and to contact trace. TCTC will maintain a COVID-19 data dashboard as directed by the Ohio Department of Health.

Diagnostic and screening testing

Students (with their families) and staff will be asked to assess any symptoms before leaving for school each day and to stay home if ill. The school nurse's office, in conjunction with our onsite health clinic and nurse practitioner, will be able to assess symptoms of staff and students. Students and staff with symptoms or suspected exposure may be tested at school in the on-site clinic.

Efforts to provide vaccinations to educators, other staff and students, if eligible

Staff was provided an opportunity to participate in a county vaccination clinic for educators during Feb/Mar 2021. An on-site vaccination clinic in partnership with a local pharmacy was offered to students and staff in May 2021. We plan to offer a vaccination clinic in fall 2021 in partnership with a local pharmacy to students and any new staff or returning staff that did not participate previously.

Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to the health and safety policies

TCTC is committed to providing equitable access to career-tech education for all students. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities will continue to be provided with respect to health and safety protocols. Students with documented disabilities that would prevent them from wearing a mask or following a health department guideline would not be required to do so if masks were to become required during the 2021-2022 school year.

Continuity of services including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff social, emotional, mental health and other needs, which may include student health and food services.**Students' academic needs**

Students will attend in-person classes five days a week for the 2021-2022 school year. TCTC will continue to provide students with an iPad to access course materials. Those in need of internet access at home will be issued a device and a data plan. Opportunities for work-based learning, internships, apprenticeships and job shadowing will provide extensions of the classroom. All students will be enrolled in an employability course designed to assist in building skills necessary for future success. Academic support will be offered in our extra-help room before, during, and after school. Summer school is offered to students to make-up credit deficiencies. Credit recovery will also be offered during the school year for 2021-2022.

Students' and staff social, emotional, and mental health/health needs

TCTC will continue a partnership with Cadence Care Network to have a school social worker available in the building five days a week. TCTC will also expand our partnership with Cadence Care Network to offer small group sessions in the school guidance office to cover topics as needed as discussed in advance with school counselors. The school social worker will collaborate with the administrative team and school counselors to provide professional development for staff. TCTC will continue a partnership with QuickMed to provide an on-site health clinic staffed by a nurse practitioner with services available to all students and staff. TCTC provided students with a no charge breakfast and lunch during the 2020-2021 school year. Full service cafeteria will continue to provide healthful food options for breakfast and lunch served in the cafeteria for the 2021-2022 school year.

Periodic review:

TCTC's administrative team will review this plan with stakeholders through September of 2023 in consultation with guidance from the Trumbull County Combined Health District and in conjunction with board policy.
