#### NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOM...

Our Preschool Expansion program began on Monday, October 3rd. We opened our doors to many happy smiles, a few tearful faces, but all in all our little friends are adjusting well to their new routine. Our preschool friends have a busy schedule in our full-day program.

**Kindergarten** students are learning how to recognize and produce rhyming words, how to retell a story, and are practicing proper letter formation. In math students are learning about fewer, more, and zero. Students are learning about 1-5 as a number and as a written word.

First grade just finished the first chapter on addition to 10 in Math. We are very excited to start subtraction in Chapter 2. The students are doing a great job reviewing letters and letter sounds in Fundations. They also really enjoy working in the different reading centers. Students are doing an amazing job working together and independently to complete the different activities in each center.

**Second grade** students sharpened their Language Arts skills by identifying and using a variety of nouns in their writing. Students brainstormed spooky nouns and wrote creative paragraphs for their October bulletin board projects. Come to our hallway to see what we have been "brewing"!

**Third graders** are starting our personal narrative writing unit. Students have been learning how to add details using the 5 senses to their paragraphs to make them more descriptive. Students also put on a readers theater for their Journeys story of the week, The Trial of Cardigan Jones.

**Fourth grade** finished their first chapter in math and are moving on to multiplication. They will learn how to multiply multi digit numbers by 1 digit numbers! In reading, the students are learning cause and effect, short I and long I words, and quotations! The 4<sup>th</sup> grade students also completed their first science investigation. They are learning that the more energy an object has, the faster it will be!

**Fifth grade** is having fun learning about body systems in science class! They are getting to experiment with various materials, (some a little yucky!) and get their hands dirty! In math they are enjoying working in our STACK centers to have hands on activities to make our lessons come alive and stick with them. They are also very excited to have the chance to take out library books again, thank you, Mrs. Tyler!

#### **SPECIAL AREAS**

In STEAM / Music, Ms. Hoffecker and Miss Bove are teaming up to combine music and art into a crossover class for 3rd, 4th and 5th grades. In STEAM, students are learning about abstract artist Wassily Kandinsky who has a condition called synesthesia which is when one of your 5 senses is supposed to be activated but sometimes other senses are activated as well. Kandinsky's case of synesthesia causes him to see colors when he is listening to music. In music, students are listening to the "Four Seasons" by Vivaldi and creating abstract artwork like Kandinsky while they listen to each season from fall, winter, spring and summer! Mrs. Heller's class closed their eyes and listened to the music to get their picture in their heads!



### In Health/Physical Education

this week students in grades K-5 are participating in the annual Spooky Bowling Tournament. During spooky bowling students are divided into rows and will demonstrate the skills necessary to safely bowl the ball down the lane and knock down as many pins as possible! Students will be working in small groups and will



rotate positions where they bowl, set up pins, return the ball, and keep score!


