NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOM...

Preschool has had a fantastic start to the school year. Our preschoolers are learning to follow the daily routine, building relationships with peers and exploring their classroom environments. We are beginning to learn about the world around us and the changing of the seasons. It has been a pleasure getting to learn about our friends and their families. We look forward to a wonderful year ahead, Preschool is so much fun!

Kindergarten were the first classes to go on a field trip this year. Our students went to Indian Acres Farm in Medford where they learned about pumpkins and gourds from Farmer Ryan. Students had the opportunity to pick pumpkins, go on a hayride, and go through a giant maze of hay bales. A fun day was had by all.



First grade is finishing up subtraction from 10. Students loved reading "The Storm" in our Journeys textbook. They also learned about different types of storms in Science and got to do a science experiment related to weather. Students are continuing to tap out and write words in Fundations. They are learning about nouns and writing sentences about pictures. Everyone really enjoys adding pictures of nouns to our "Noun Town."

Second grade participated in the Week of Respect spirit week activities. We continued to learn ways to treat each other respectfully through the children's literature, and corresponding language art activities.

Third graders are learning about ways to collect and graph data by using picture graphs, bar graphs, and line graphs. Officer Kendall made his first visit to discuss stranger danger and ways to be safe around the community.

Fourth grade students are wrapping up Unit 1 in Reading and Language Arts. The students also finished Chapter 2 in math. They are masters at multiplying multi digit numbers by 1 digit numbers! Next chapter they will learn how to multiply two digit numbers by two digit numbers. In science, the students are continuing to learn about the different types of energy!

Fifth graders are excited to start writing their Spooky Narratives! They have been doing an excellent job working in groups to go over all of the elements of writing narratives. The best part so far was talking about sensory details. We didn't just get to talk about them, we were able to feel them, smell them, and even taste some of those details! Students are also enjoying learning about figurative language and how using it can make our writings "pop!"

Music

In music this week, all students are learning the "Pass the Pumpkin" song. We are playing a game similar to "hot potato" with a pumpkin and when it lands on you, you



get to leave the circle and play an instrument. Students are getting to choose between the maraca, rhythm sticks, hand drum and triangle.

STEAM



Kindergarten through third grade students continue to study Wassily Kandinski art. They are choosing warm or cool colors to complete a concentric circle. Complete circles will be placed together to decorate our multi-media room.

Fourth and fifth grade students are choosing a Wassily Kandinski project, from the STEAM website, to complete in a small group or independently. Choices involve the following: Engineering Wiggle Bots or Wind Lifts, Ozobot robot color coding adventures, Abstract Art, Concentric Circles, Japanese Marbling and Stop Motion Animation.

Quest

The fourth and fifth grade classes have been examining their finger-prints this week. They learned how fingerprints are unique, and how they are used in the real world. After using ink to mark their fingerprint, they looked to see if they could match the other fingerprints to the right people in class.



Second and third grade students continue to practice their map skills by creating an accurate map of the QUEST classroom. Kindergarten and first grade classes learned about how certain groups of Native Americans built Totem Poles, and they built their own to take home.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The following changes were made with the input of staff and parents:

- No political costumes

The Charles Street School Halloween Parade will begin at 1:15 PM. Class parties will immediately follow. Only **Room Parents** may assist the teacher during the classroom party. Dismissal will be at 2:30 promptly.

Please notify your child's teacher if they are not permitted to participate in Halloween activities. If your student is not participating and you will be signing them out of school for the afternoon, please do so by 12:45.




