#### **NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOM...**

Preschool The first six weeks of our Preschool curriculum have flown by! We are about to enter our next curriculum unit of Balls. Preschoolers enjoy exploring Balls. It helps to build our curiosity about how people use balls and what they are made of. We will also discover what is inside a ball, how balls can be used for work, and how high they can bounce. We will also talk about the different sizes, textures, and weights of balls. Balls are going to make a really interesting and engaging study to help us learn. Preschool is so much fun!

**Kindergarten** started to learn how to sign into our Chromebooks along with iReady and Happy Numbers. We are very excited to add these to our small group rotation. In math we started addition. Fundations we are reviewing letters already taught along with learning about p & j. We will be making holiday cards for the Palmyra High School Band Annual Craft fair. We will continue reading stories to reinforce manners and being kind.

First grade has had a lot of fun during the first marking period. We are successfully working in learning centers during reading and math. Currently we are in Unit 2 of the Journeys reading series. In Fundations, we are successfully tapping out and reading words with digraphs. In Math, we just finished up Chapter 3 where we learned many different strategies to add numbers with sums larger than 10. We are excited to start our next chapter where we will learn different strategies to subtract from numbers larger than 10. The students also really enjoyed sharing with their classmates "who they are thankful for and why" for our November bulletin board.

Second grade This week second grade is learning all about super storms and how each storms displays different characteristics. After taking a quick poll our students think the hurricane is the worst storm while a blizzard doesn't seem that bad because they can have a snowball fight and make a fort with all of that snow! Starting chapter 4 in math takes steps to learn how to add two-digit numbers with regrouping. Learning strategies to help find the answer to each problem gives us great tools in our math backpack.

Third grade is finishing up with their first chapter on understanding multiplication! Students made turkey arrays to show different ways to represent a multiplication problem including an array, repeated addition, multiplication problem, and word problem to match their math fact. In reading, students are learning about non-fiction text features and why they are important.

Fourth grade students have started their division unit in math! In reading and language arts the students are learning about fact and opinion, verb tenses, and how to summarize. The students are also switching over to social studies for the second marking period and will start with learning about geography & where NJ is located on the globe!

**Fifth graders** are looking forward to ending our Philanthropy unit by packaging 1,200 utensil packets for the Cathedral Kitchen in Camden. They have been learning a lot about people who don't have enough to meet their basic needs. We are hopeful that these lessons have taught them the importance of gratitude, especially at this time of Thanksgiving.


