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Spring Break - Schools are closed! April 7th—April 14th

Preschool are learning about the signs of spring. We are learning about the plant life cycle and what a plant needs to grow. We are enjoying using the song, The Green Grass Grows All Around All Around to help us recall the life cycle of a seed growing into a tree. Preschool is so much FUN!

Kindergarten has been reading stories and doing some projects for women's history month on Mae Jameson, Heller Keller etc., Kindergarten has been learning about national parks and what a park ranger does for project night. We have been working on sentence structure and opinion writing. In math we care continuing with place values and addition and subtraction review.

First Grade has had a lot of fun learning about Carlsbad Caverns for Project Night. We loved making bats for the bulletin board. We really enjoyed watching our "stalactites" grow. In Reading, we just finished our Journeys story "Where Does Food Come From." The students found it very interesting learning about where different foods they eat come from. In Fundations, we just finished up Unit 8 where we learned to read and write words with different "glued" sounds. In Math, we learned many different strategies to add 2 digit numbers. For Writing, we have been doing a great job using sequencing cards to write Informative pieces that tell "how to" do many different things, from making valentines to building sand castles, and shopping for groceries.

Second Grade students proudly displayed their Yosemite National Park projects for Project Night. Among their many areas of study, students learned about the owl food web, the flora and fauna, and the amazing landforms found in Yosemite National Park. Students researched animals, landforms, and plant life to create google slides highlighting their research. In addition, second graders learned how owls hunt and digest their prey. They had the opportunity to dissect owl pellets in which they identified the bones of the owls' prey.



Third Graders were thrilled to finally share their Yellowstone National Park projects with their families at Project Night 2023! Students learned all about Yellowstone including Old Faithful Geyser, the Great Prismatic Spring, the animals found there, and its iconic hiking trails. Students each made Yellowstone landform projects using clay, paint, and paper plates. Each student made their own park ranger with their faces on them to help make their projects come to life!

Fourth Graders had so much fun studying Sequoia National Park for project night! The students are beginning to wrap up their Earth Science unit. In Reading and Language arts the 4th graders are continuing their weekly stories. In math students are starting to learn all about geometry! We are really looking forward to spring break and all the fun events that will be happening in the spring!

Mrs. McCann's class worked very hard learning and reporting on Sequoia National Park. They created Sequoia trees, with the help of Mrs. Streeper, and displayed our landform and bodies of water maps. They also created book reports, banner facts, and postcards for our families! The students also made homemade Irish potatoes! They were super sweet, and read The Leprechaun in the Basement. We have also been working hard on our multiplication facts, creating arrays, and learning how to use tools for solving problems.

Fifth-Graders are having fun "running" and "jumping" into our new math unit on line plots and coordinate planes! We've enjoyed learning how to use data differently. The students are especially looking forward to playing class Battleship between the Navy and Pirates!
