
Middle schools do not have Spring conferences. Parents are welcome to call the office to schedule a conference if they feel one would be helpful for their student.

Your support for the two levies on February's ballot means so very much to the students and staff at 10thStreet School and across the Marysville School District.

The passage of these two important measures will help us maintain current levels of instruction and support for students, and ensure we can continue efforts to serve the 'whole child' during their time in school.

Classroom teachers and instructional aides who support students with special needs and individual learning needs will be able to provide them with the assistance and encouragement necessary for success in the classroom.

Our students will also continue to have the counselors that work to support their emotional health and prevent barriers to success, such as limited access to food and shelter. Your support maintains the nurses and health room assistants that tend to our students and help keep them safe and healthy.

Your support enables us to continue to provide the same level of transportation access for students across our district. This includes ensuring homeless and transitional students can continue to attend their home school regardless of their family situation, and that all students have ample transportation to sporting events, extracurricular opportunities, and after school activities.

Your support also prevents cuts to the arts, music, athletics and the extracurricular programs that are crucial to keeping our kids excited about school. It's also a fact that students who are involved in extracurricular activities are more likely be college and career-bound.

We are now able to fund some critical facility retrofits and replacements needed over the next few years. This includes everything from roof and gutter replacements, to new flooring. And your support ensures that access to technology is a basic right for students at 10thStreet and across the Marysville School District.
