

A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT





Happy 2023-2024 School Year, G-A Ram Family:

The energy was inspiring this week as our school staff reported back to work. We also welcomed some new members to the Ram Family. Like all other districts across the county and state of Michigan, the teacher shortage is real and it has made hiring new staff more difficult than in years past. In talking with other district superintendents, we are all struggling to find enough teachers to fill positions. The number of young adults going into education has dropped by more than 50%. However, I am grateful that GACS has been able to fill all but one position. Mr. VanDyk has been appointed to be our Dean/Behavior Academic Support Specialist at the Middle School. I believe that Ms. Amy Pratt, the new MS principal, and Mr. VanDyk are going to make a great new leadership team at our middle school. Mr. Sportel is searching for a 3rd grade teacher to replace Mr. VanDyk and we are hoping to have that completed by the time students return to the classroom.

Inside the walls of every school building is the **future**. Teaching is an awesome responsibility and our students deserve the best. Our teachers deserve to be paid well for all they do. Especially in smaller districts, how Michigan funds schools hinders us from competing with other larger districts who can offer greater pay. Yet, so many staff choose to stay at G-A because we truly are *Small Towns*, *Big Hearts*. One can walk our halls and meet administrators, teachers and support staff who care about our students and support one another. For that I am extremely grateful and honored to be the leader.

What else am I grateful for? Our district's new three year strategic plan. This past June more than forty staff, administrators, parents and community members spent a full day reflecting and writing G-A's next strategic plan. We used data that we collected during this past school year. Many of you may have participated in those focus groups and completed surveys. Using all that data, the group rethought our mission and vision for the future.

As the world changes, so must we rethink who we are and why we exist. We also looked inward and were able to articulate the values and beliefs by which GACS will educate our littlest and biggest Rams. We hope that as you and your children return to school, you will feel our mission: to develop personal connections and innovative learning pathways for each student to become a successful individual.

I am also grateful for our community trusting and believing in us. The addition and renovations to the Primary School are getting their final touches. Our ribbon cutting will occur Wednesday before open house. This past year our third graders watched their new classrooms being built with excitement. Cranes and other big equipment operated outside their windows. And now, as fourth graders they are excited to move in. Our fourth grade teachers have returned from middle school and have spent lots of hours unpacking and setting up among new furniture, spacey cupboards, large whiteboards and flexible seating. Our new STEAM classroom will provide a flexible work space for students to create new knowledge. They will investigate, innovate, problem solve and create solutions to realworld problems. Our STEAM teacher, Brenda Latinga, is excited to have a space that will truly accommodate such exploration.

Also this fall, we are excited to open our new athletic facilities built behind the high school. Construction will be completed by the end of September and we will host a home football game against Saugatuck on October 6th. It will truly be a grand opening as this is a celebration of our students and the community. Please find details on our website and FB pages as we celebrate the future of GACS. We hope our community will join us for this big event. IMAGINE: Holding our first home track meet next spring in over 20 years! And our PE students walking out of the building onto the track and field and completing healthy living habits. None of this could happen without you and the rest of the Ram Family. On behalf of the Board of Education and speaking for our staff and students, THANK YOU.

Having a School Resource Officer (SRO) program in the district can dramatically improve the safety and security of the district. It can also serve to improve relationships between law enforcement and our school community. Successful SROs can develop and foster relationships



with students and staff, and work to ensure the school district maintains a safe and secure environment with a strong focus on preventative measures. SROs can also improve the overall climate of the district. Many SRO's for example, serve as mentors to students. With younger students, he can inspire youth to be their best.

Deputy Murphy will be a part of our district's safety planning team. His expertise will provide guidance on drills and training; he will be able to work alongside administrators and social workers to identify resources needed by the district. We also will include him on our district's chronic absenteeism team. You will start to see Deputy Murphy around the district soon. His start date was Monday, August 21st.

Dear Ram Fam,



We are looking forward to another great year with our students in G-A! And this year, regular school attendance is a priority. As always, regular school attendance is important, but this year it is a major focus. Our goal is that every student in the district misses no more than (9) nine school days this year.



Research shows that students who miss just 1.5 days of school a month, will miss the equivalent of over a year of instruction by high school graduation. We also know that when students miss too much school, regardless of the reason, it can cause them to fall behind both academically, emotionally and socially. Prior to the pandemic, approximately 8 million students nationwide were chronically absent (missing 10 percent or more of school days in a school year due to an absence for any reason). Since Covid-19, that number has *doubled*.

We need your help, now more than ever, to make sure our students are attending regularly. Please send your child to school every day unless he or she has a fever or a contagious illness. We will be monitoring all student attendance across the year so that we can support families when absences become a concern. If your child is at risk of missing more than nine days of school, please contact any of the following staff members for assistance:

From our Transportation Director:

Welcome back, students! The Transportation Department at Galesburg-Augusta Community Schools works hard each day to ensure that all bus riders arrive safely to school and back home again. We are asking our Ram Fam to support us by talking to your students about following these simple but important procedures:



- **Be on time:** Make sure your child arrives at the designated bus stop five-ten minutes early each day.
- 10 20 feet: Students should wait for the bus safely and in an orderly fashion, back from the roadway. Behavior problems at the bus stop can create hazardous conditions for children and drivers.
- Wait for the signal: When the bus arrives, your child should wait for the bus driver's signal before boarding. Children should board single file.
- **Ride safely & respectfully:** Teach your child to sit calmly on the bus ride to and from school. Loud noises or behaviors can distract the bus driver, and it is important that they are able to concentrate on driving safely.



S.A.C. ATHLETIC ADMISSION CHANGES

As we get ready to start the 2023-24 academic and athletic year, I would like to provide everyone with an update on some changes with the athletic admission policies in our athletic conference and neighboring conferences. The price of admission will now be \$4 for middle school athletic events and \$6 for high school athletic events in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (our conference). Other conferences have raised their admission prices to \$5 for middle school and \$7 for high school events. Please be prepared if we are playing at a non-conference school.

The reason for the change in admission prices is due to the increase in officials' pay. So why the need to increase the pay? Unfortunately, we have seen a drastic decline in the number of officials over the past few years. There are several contests that are canceled each year due to officials being unavailable or contests that take place with a partial officiating crew. There are multiple reasons for this decline, but the number one reason is the abuse that has been directed towards officials by spectators. Raising the pay will hopefully attract more officials while we work on better ways to support them.

Galesburg-Augusta students will continue to receive free admission at our regular season home events. Please note, **students in grades K-6 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to receive free admission**. Students in grades 7-12 need to present their student I.D. to receive free admission.

Senior citizens will continue to receive free admission for S.A.C. events with a senior citizen pass. Passes are free and are available in the middle school or high school offices. Most leagues accept the pass as well for free admission or at a discounted rate.

One last item to note - While many school districts will be using on-line ticket sale and/or credit/debit card only, G-ACS will continue to accept cash. We will also be using card readers this year, for those who would like to use a credit/debit card. We will be putting a link on the school website that will list the policy at each league school. NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students who are 18 years of age or older ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after the day the Galesburg-Augusta Community Schools receives a request for access.

Parents or eligible students who wish to inspect their child's or their education records should submit to the school principal a written request that identifies the records they wish to inspect. The school official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.

Parents or eligible students who wish to ask Galesburg-Augusta Community Schools to amend their child's or their education record should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed and specify why it should be changed. If the school decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the school will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

3. The right to provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information (PII) from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. The criteria for determining who constitutes a school official and what constitutes a legitimate educational interest must be set forth in the school's or school district's annual notification for FERPA rights. A school official typically includes a person employed by the school or school district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel) or a person serving on the school board. A school official typically has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
