A Message from the Superintendent

Greetings and Happy 2018!

As we are now deep into the winter season, a few reminders might be helpful. We do use a robo call system to notify families when school is delayed or cancelled. However, it is not the only way we communicate. We also notify T.V. and radio stations, tweet it out, and use Facebook when schools have that tool available. Decisions to delay or close are made by 6:00 a.m., which is when our buses head out for first pick-ups; rarely do we have to decide after 6:00 a.m., so if you think there should be a delay or cancellation and you have not yet gotten a call, please check the T.V. and radio stations, as well, and let your school know if you did not get a call that you know went out.

On days when the temperatures are below 0 degrees, we work hard to keep our buses from freezing up and not starting. At times, we are unsuccessful. If that happens, we will make a general call to let people know bus routes may be delayed. However, we are unable to call each family. On these freezing days, be sure to stay inside and dress your kids for the weather!

Budget decisions should be coming to an end this month as the Barstow board meets to decide their budget on January 8th and Otter Valley Unified on January 10th. The Barstow board meets in the Barstow School library and the Otter Valley board meets at the high school for their budget meetings. Regular School Attendance

Regular school attendance is essential for children's academic success. Our school district has a policy related to school attendance and has asked schools to implement practices which support that policy by encouraging regular attendance for all students. The practice we will implement here at L.C.S. will be to send parents/guardians letters when their children have been absent or tardy for 5, and then 10, 15, and 20 days and to set up meetings with them when a child has been absent and/or tardy a total of 15 or more times during a school year. Our hope is that these meetings will be helpful in encouraging regular school attendance by identifying and resolving situations which may be challenges to that. In rare situations, the school may seek the support of the Office of the State's Attorney to assist in ensuring regular school attendance as required by law.

The policy is as follows: "The Rutland Northeast Supervisory Union and the State of Vermont are continuing their efforts to ensure that students attend school for a full school day. Students are required by state law to attend school unless excused for illness or a family emergency. If a student is going to be absent or tardy, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian(s) to notify the school, in writing, whenever possible. An absence or tardiness is considered unexcused until the school hears from the parent/guardian(s) with a valid excuse such as illness, family emergency, or pre-approved educational activity. When students are absent or tardy, the school documents the cumulative incidences of tardiness and/or absence of each student, which may be used for truancy proceedings. Support services are offered as needed."

The P.T.O. is a good forum in which to ask questions and voice concerns. Your input is valued and appreciated as we work together to educate the children of Leicester. Interim Student Reports

Report cards for students are prepared three times a year: in November, March, and June. Half-way between these trimesters, interim reports are prepared and distributed and sent home with students to inform parents/guardians of their children's progress in academic and behavioral areas. We had planned to distribute interim reports on Friday, January 12th but realized that if we pushed the date back one week (to January 19th) instead, we would be able to include updated assessment data in those reports. Therefore, please expect your child to bring home her/his interim report on Friday, January 19th, instead of January 12th.
